The 2024/25 season got underway throughout our four divisions with plenty of early drama.

In the Premier South, Merthyr Town made their intentions clear as they hit Tiverton Town for six with Ricardo Rees and new signing, Kane Simpson, both helping themselves to hat-tricks.

There was a winning introduction to life in this League for Chertsey Town as they beat Hungerford Town 4-1, whilst fellow new-boys, Frome Town, secured an excellent away win at Gosport Borough.

It was dramatic stuff at Taunton Town as they raced into a three-goal lead against Gloucester City only to have to settle for a point in the end from a 3-3 draw.

AFC Totton began life with a hard-earned I-0 victory over Walton & Hersham.

Over in Premier Central. Stratford Town were commanding victors over Leiston, whilst a new-look Stourbridge left it late to beat St. Ives Town as the returning Alex Moore hit a stoppage time winner.
Spalding United got off to a winning start against
Bedford Town and Biggleswade Town shared the spoils
with AFC Telford United.

In Division One South, Helston Athletic's first-ever game at this level ended in a 2-1 win at Westbury United as fellow new-boys, Shaftesbury were held at home by Malvern Town.

The fancied Bristol Manor Farm couldn't find a way through Melksham Town, whilst Exmouth Town started with a solid 3-0 success against Thatcham Town.

Division One Central saw Flackwell Heath (pictured) enjoy their day as they romped to a 6-0 triumph, whilst Hadley hit five without reply against Barton Rovers. New-boys, Real Bedford, won 2-0 as Enfield came from behind to beat North Leigh.

The new-boys drew first blood as Ademide Baruwa fired home in the opening exchanges only for Bradley Wadkins to bring the sides level towards the end of the opening period.


There was still time for Aiden Read to see red for the visitors before the break, but they were able to edge in front in the opening exchanges of the second period through Bailey Stevenson.

It was his goalscoring exploits for the Dolphins that earned him a move into The Football League with Swindon Town in 2009 and since then he has appeared in each of the top four leagues, serving the likes of Burnley, Queens Park Rangers, Southampton and West Bromwich Albion.

Now he is eager to help AFC Totton reach the next level after they just missed out last term in the play-offs.

"This is an opportunity that suits me and my family," said Austin. "The club initially contacted me in May and we have kept in touch over the summer.

"It was during a recent family holiday when the penny finally dropped and I contacted the club to say let's get the deal done, it really was as simple as that.

"It's important for me to be able to play football with a smile on my face and if I can do that whilst helping this club progress, I will be very happy.

"The club has shown plenty of patience and I have really appreciated that. I'll bring experience, know-how and hopefully goals.

"All of the strikers will challenge each other to be better and that kind of competition is healthy. They give us plenty of high-quality options.

It was a long process; we had to make sure that things were right for him and his family and also right for the club. "It was a well thought out deal and he comes here full of enthusiasm and an eagerness to get stuck into the action. "His quality and know-how is obvious;

FLACKWELL HEATH | FRESH AYRES

It's been quite a journey for Flackwell Heath manager, Chris Ayres, as he prepares for life in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central.

"To achieve promotion at the end of only my third season managing at this level makes me extremely proud," he told us. "Last season was amazing; to win the Combined Counties League Premier North Division title ahead of the much-fancied Rayners Lane, was an unbelievable achievement.

"We went into the campaign looking to get into the play-offs, but we made some key signings over the course of the season and we were able to come out on top. "Our crowds went up massively, and it culminated in an attendance of over 600 for our final home game. It was a privilege to manage this group of players, who gave me everything, and now we look forward to what the season ahead holds

Ayres has been a full-time coach at the FAB Academy, based at The National Sports Centre in Bisham Abbey, for the past 14 years. He also took on the coaching of the Flackwell Heath Minors team during this time and hasn't looked back since.

"I just love coaching," he continued. "I always try to help improve and develop players individually; it's important to create a good coaching environment for the players and I have been able to do that at Flackwell Heath.

"It started with the Minors and I am proud to say that seven of those plays have stayed on the journey with me and have progressed to play in the first-team here.

"We have progressed together and whilst we know that the season ahead will be a tough challenge, we are looking forward to it. "As is always the way, we've lost a couple of players and we're looking to make a couple more additions to help bolster the group. "Last season we competed well against Step 4 clubs in the FA Cup, so hopefully that will give us the belief for the campaign ahead. We've got a number of players who have played at this level before and I am sure that they will more than hold their own.

"I'm certainly not going to make any predictions at this stage, particularly with the amount of quality sides in this League.

"As a collective we want to keep improving and moving in the right direction. We want to play the type of football that the fans will enjoy watching and which also brings us results.

"I hope that the crowds stay healthy as I know that it really inspires the boys, both home and away. We have set targets internally but first and foremost the aim is to stay in the League; we won't be getting too far ahead of ourselves." Ayres' side opened the season earlier today with a home game against last season's play-off semi-finalists, AFC Dunstable.

SHAFTESBURY | A WHOLE NEW WORLD

It's going to be a 'whole new world' for Shaftesbury as began life in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South this afternoon at home to Malvern Town.

Success in the play-offs saw them gain promotion from the Wessex League Premier Division at the end of last term and in doing so reach the highest level in the club's history.

"I can't wait for the challenge ahead," manager, James Milligan told us. "My new co-manager, Pat McManus, the players, supporters and everyone connected to the club is really looking forward to this.

"It's going to be a whole new world for us. We'll be up against a host of new teams and we are expecting a very tough and long season against some of the talented squads in this division.

"We have been keen to stress to the players over the summer how much work we have to do in order to get something from the season.

"For me it's all about positive football and we'll be working hard to produce a creative and attacking side at this level.

"My passion for the game is there for all to see. I love working with the players and also developing the club off-the-pitch through my other roles here. "The season ahead will be a new challenge and a new adventure. Both Pat and I go into this season with no previous Southern League experience, but what

we do bring is a combined wealth of many years in coaching and managing.

"We're going to enjoy the experience and want to see smiles on everyone's face around the club. Some of the players have previously played at Steps 3 and 4, so there's no reason why we can't aim for a place in that top five.

"We relish the challenge ahead and whatever happens, we wil just go out there, give it our all and enjoy operating at this level."
