REDS DRAMA



The top two in the Pitching In Southern League Premier South both failed to win as Merthyr Town were held to a 2-2 away draw at Dorchester Town, whilst Gloucester City succumbed to a 2-0 home reverse at the hands of Bracknell Town.

At the bottom, Marlow enjoyed only their second League win of the season as they beat Wimborne Town 3-2 in what was an entertaining encounter.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, the leaders also failed to win as a last-minute equaliser gave Bedford Town a 2-2 draw at Kettering Town as our Game of the Day lived up to its billing.

It was quite a day for Redditch United as they announced this morning that Matt Clarke was returning as manager to replace Tim Flowers and then recovered from going a goal down to beat Stamford 2-1 courtesy of a dramatic stoppage time winner from Alex Cameron. The result leaves them third.

Both Bishop's Stortford and Leiston had good 3-1 away wins at Spalding United and St. Ives Town respectively.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, Exmouth Town were able to close the gap on leaders, Yate Town, who were in Isuzu FA Trophy action, courtesy of a hard-earned 1-0 win at Westbury United.

Melksham Town moved into the top five after they brushed aside Thatcham Town by four goals to nil. There was also an entertaining win for Evesham United as they beat Helston Athletic 3-2.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, Berkhamsted are just a point off the lead now after they were made to work hard for a 1-0 triumph over Leverstock Green, whilst Barton Rovers are now fourth after another win, this time against Kings Langley.

There was plenty of joy for our Member Clubs in the Isuzu FA Trophy second round. Hadley beat AFC Telford United 1-0, in-form Chertsey Town also defeated higher level opponents with a 3-2 success at Bath City.

Biggleswade Town came out on the right side of a nine-goal thriller at Coleshill Town. All of the results are listed inside.

Dorchester Town 2 Merthyr Town 2

Northwood 1 Stotfold 0

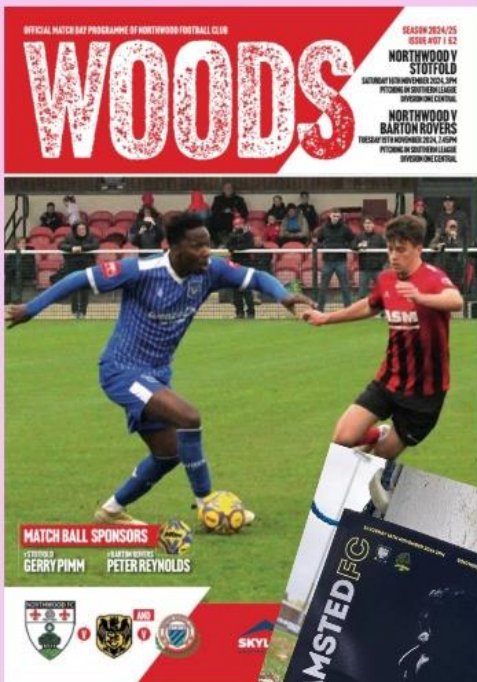

RECORD BREAKER

It was an emotional evening at Wimborne Town on Tuesday as club captain, **Scott Arnold**, finally hung up his boots after a record-breaking 618 appearances over two decades.

Arnold was just 18 when he made his senior debut for the club in 2003 and has gone on to become an extremely popular figure both on and off the field.

He played a key role as they secured their place back in Step 3 by taking the Pitching In Southern League Division One South title at the end of last term and although he considered retirement then, he decided to play on for a little while longer until finally deciding last Sunday that the Dorset Senior Cup clash with Weymouth on Tuesday evening would be his last game for the club.

“You know when the time is right to hang up your boots and this is my time,” he said. “I’ve got the club appearance record now and whilst my head is telling me to carry on, my body is saying that it’s time to put my feet up.

“The game has changed so much since I first started playing; the players these days are athletes and they look after themselves so well.

“I am proud of my record; loyalty has always been a big thing for me and my legacy will live on for a long time to come. In this day and age players don’t tend to stay at one club for so long. It will be difficult to beat this record but it’s there for someone to chase down.

“Wimborne is a great club to be at, it’s a club very close to my heart. I’ve been through nine managers here and each time you have to prove yourself, but I have played under so many good managers and alongside some fantastic players.

“I’ve made so many friends and created so many special memories along the way. Winning the title last season was fantastic but from a personal point of view, the last minute overhead kick winner against Halesowen Town where we came back from four goals down to win 5-4 has to be right up there.

“This is all I’ve ever known but it’s a chance to spend more time with my family now. I love the game but I’ll take a bit of time out and then see what my options are. Wimborne are keen to keep me here in some capacity, but I am not sure what at this stage.

“It was an emotional occasion on Tuesday. The build-up was amazing and I can’t thank everyone enough for their well wishes and to see a crowd of over 400 there for the game, with so many familiar faces, it just shows what the football community is all about.”

The Magpies lost the game 3-0 at the hands of higher-level Weymouth but they have adapted well to the added demands of the Pitching In Southern League Premier South with six wins from their opening 15 League games.

“The team has started well,” added Arnold. “We went into the season with our eyes wide open as to how tough it would be. This is a tough, competitive League but it’s been an amazing start with the club in a strong position on the pitch as well as off it.



“There’s a solid foundation here to build on and I have no doubt that we have the players and staff here to do it, backed by a fantastic set of supporters who have given me so much love over the years and it’s been an absolute honour to play in front of them.”

NEWS ROUND-UP

MERTHYR TOWN | HOT SHOT REES

Following another five-goal haul last weekend, Merthyr Town now have an impressive tally of 45 goals from their opening 14 Pitching In Southern League Premier South games.

19 of those goals have come from Ricardo Rees, who weighed in with his second four-goal haul of the season on Saturday in the 5-1 success over Havant & Waterlooville, to also go along with the hat-trick he grabbed on the opening day of the campaign.

"After last season, I expected a good ratio but nothing quite like this," Rees admitted to us. "To sit here with 19 League goals already and we're not even halfway through November is way beyond my expectations during the summer.

"It's been a strong start to the season for us. We used the disappointment of missing out on the play-offs by just a point last year having been in the top five for most of the season as extra motivation to prove a lot of people wrong.

"To beat one of the fancied sides so convincingly at the weekend shows where we are as a team, but I still feel like there's a lot more that we can give.

"It's too early to look too much into things; nothing is ever won or lost in November, but we're in a very promising position as it stands and we're playing with a lot of confidence and belief.

"This League is the best it's been in years as there are a lot of teams with the same ambition to progress into the next level. It makes for a very exciting battle over the weeks and months ahead. "Our aim is to finish at the very top. If we can do that and I finish leading scorer as well, then I will be a very happy man!"

The Welsh outfit headed to Dorchester Town today.



AFC TELFORD UNITED | STENSON IN THE GROOVE

It's certainly shaping up to be a closely-fought battle at the top of the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central with the top five separated by just three points. Two of those teams went head-to-head last weekend with AFC Telford United coming from behind to secure a good 3-1 win at Stamford as Matty Stenson hit two second half goals to see his side to victory.

"I was delighted to be able to play my part in getting the three points against opponents who are right up there with us," Stenson told us. "We started the game slowly; Stamford dominated the opening 20 minutes and for us to go a goal down and still win at what is a difficult place to go to is massive credit to the lads.

"We know that as a group, we've started the season slowly. Personally it's also been a bit frustrating as I picked up an injury, but we've started to find a bit of rhythm recently and hopefully we can push on from here now.

"One look at the table shows how close it is at this stage and I'm expecting that to continue right up until the end of the season. All we can do is focus on we do and ensure that we're doing our jobs rather than worry too much about what is happening elsewhere.

"A club of this size should be right up there challenging and I want to do all I can to ensure that we remain in the leading pack. Promotion is the ultimate aim, of course, and coming so close last time out, we want to make sure we go one better this time around.

"We have the belief and the quality to do it, so we need to prove it and if I can contribute with a healthy tally of goals then I will be happy."

The Bucks went down to a 3-1 home defeat at the hands of League leaders, Kettering Town, on Tuesday evening and today they are on Isuzu FA Trophy as they take on Hadley of the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central.

HERTFORD TOWN | THE WAIT IS OVER

After a 224-day wait, Pitching In Southern League Division One Central outfit, Hertford Town, finally kept a clean sheet last Saturday as they claimed a good 1-0 win on their travels at Welwyn Garden City.

For goalkeeper, James Callan, who arrived at the club in September, he was quick to share the plaudits with the defence in front of him.

"As a goalkeeper, it's always nice to keep a clean sheet, but the plaudits should go to the back-line in front of me who were superb throughout," he told his club's media. "We're working on things all of the time as a defensive unit and this is starting to show now.

"It was a difficult game played in difficult conditions; when you come to a place like this you have to fight for everything and we did that with a very positive performance.

"There were times towards the end when we had to hang on, but the support of our fans pulled us through and I would like to thank them too for the part that they played."

Manager, Ben Herd, has praised the impact of the 20 year-old who joined the club in mid-September from Hitchin Town.

"When we were tested on Saturday, James and the back-line stood up to the task, especially in the closing stages of the game," he said. "James has been an excellent signing for us; he's a great character who has helped to bring the group together.

"He's probably the oldest 20 year-old I've ever met, but his performances since joining us have been excellent and will only get better.

"I am pleased that he was able to get his first clean sheet at the weekend and hopefully there are more to come."

The Blues sit five places off the bottom of the table and were at home to Leighton Town earlier today.



MIDWEEK ACTION

Tuesday evening's action saw just one game take place in the Pitching In Southern League Premier South as a Jack Mazzone give Chertsey Town a good 3-0 victory over Basingstoke Town.

There were three games in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, including a mouth-watering encounter at AFC Telford United where leaders, Kettering Town, secured a 3-1 triumph. Jonny Edwards and Tyree Wilson gave the Poppies a two-goal advantage at the break before Edwards extended the lead on the hour-mark. A late goal from Orrin Pendley proved to be mere consolation for the hosts.

Also winning away were Bishop's Stortford as they claimed a 2-1 victory at Harborough Town.
