There was a full programme of action throughout our four divisions and plenty of late drama.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South, leaders, Merthyr Town, edged a tough trip to Havant & Waterlooville by one goal to nil, but it was somewhat more dramatic for second-place AFC Totton. They found themselves behind at home to Gosport Borough early in the second half, however, the visitors went on to have two men sent off before succumbing to two goals in the final ten minutes.

Both Poole Town and Swindon Supermarine won 1-0 courtesy of last-gasp strikes.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, there are new leaders as AFC Telford United take top spot following a 2-0 triumph over Stamford. It came after Kettering Town lost a see-saw encounter at Redditch United which went one way and then the other as the hosts ultimately won it 3-2.

Harborough Town are into the top five following another win, whilst in-form Spalding United also tasted success with a commanding 3-0 victory over Stratford Town.

There's no stopping Yate Town in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South as they won again, this time 2-0 at Larkhall Athletic

Behind them, Exmouth Town, Evesham United and Mousehole were all held to draws with the only other winner in the top five being Bishops Cleeve who secured a hard-earned 1-0 triumph at Tavistock AFC.

In-form Falmouth Town had a big 6-0 away win at Thatcham Town, whilst Cinderford Town battled out a goalless draw at Bristol Manor Farm.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, the top two both won 3-1. Real Bedford didn't have it all of their own way as they overcame the challenge of Leverstock Green, whilst an impressive first half showing saw Berkhamsted victorious at Northwood.

Flackwell Heath came from behind to beat Enfield 2-1 with the winning goal coming deep into stoppage time to put them third after Barton Rovers had 'one of those days' at Leighton Town as they lost 2-0 and had a player sent off.

AFC Totton 2 Gosport Borough 1

After a goalless first half, Alfie Stanley wasted little time after the restart to put the visitors in front.

Dorchester Town 1 Bracknell Town 0

The home side had to be patient against well-organised opponents, but the opening goal finally arrived midway through the second half courtesy of Olaf Konzsla and it ended up being the difference between these two teams.

Gloucester City 2 Sholing 1

Royston Town 0 Harborough Town 2

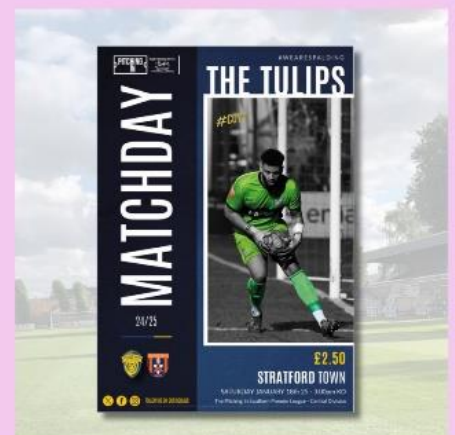

POOLE TOWN | BIG AMBITIONS

Tuesday evening saw Poole Town skipper, Jamie Whisken, break the club's appearance record when he made his 492nd outing.

It ended in a 2-1 defeat for his side at Chertsey Town, but the 37 year-old is excited by what the future holds in store for him and the club.

"The season has been tough so far," he admitted to us. "With 14 new players coming in, it was always going to take time for them to gel, but we've got a good squad and we believe in the process and each other.

"I've no doubt that our fortunes will start to turn and we'll climb up the table to give ourselves a platform on which to build.

"I still feel that I am destined to lift the Southern League trophy one more time in my career and hopefully that will be next season!

"From a personal point of view, I am 37 years of age now and still feel fit and well in my own body. I can't ask for any more than that; I have to manage things a bit more these days, but I am able to play back-to-back games and still have the same passion for the game that I've always had.

"To get the appearance record is something that I will be proud of for years to come. I don't think that the achievement will properly sink in until I stop playing but I have thoroughly enjoyed it here from the moment I first arrived during the summer of 2013.

"We had a very settled local squad for a long time and that was the basis for our success. There have been a lot of changes over the past 18 months or so but I firmly believe that the club is only going in one direction and that's up.

"It will be nice to reach the 500 appearance landmark, but my main focus is on getting this club moving up the Pitching In Southern League Premier South table and then helping us build from there."

With Joe Lea and Pat Suraci recently installed at the helm following their departure from Gosport Borough, there's a real feeling of positivity around the Dolphins and they returned to home action earlier today with the visit of Basingstoke Town.



BRISTOL MANOR FARM | GRUBB'S UP

The freezing temperatures and fog may have decimated the fixture list last weekend, but there was plenty of entertainment in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South where Bristol Manor Farm came from behind three times to secure a point at Bishops Cleeve, with the leveller arriving deep into stoppage time at the end.

There was plenty of action to warm up the crowd with Evander Grubb in particular putting in another sparkling display for the FARMY ARMY, which was rewarded with a goal early in the second half.

The talented Grubb rose to prominence with Bristol Manor Farm in 2020 before securing a scholarship at Huddersfield Town.

During his time up in Yorkshire he had a couple of loan spells back at his former club before joining Taunton Town on a permanent basis.

"Saturday's game saw us put in an excellent team performance. A sickness bug meant that we were missing a few starters and had to play a number of players out of position, but despite all of this, we did really well to bring home a point from a top side.

"It just shows the character we have here that we kept going until the very last kick to get our reward, having come from behind three times.

"I was pleased with my own contribution overall and I am always happy to chip in with a goal.

"This is a very unpredictable League this season where everyone has proved that they are capable of beating each other.

"I've seen the amount of quality already since I've been back here and there's no doubt that Division One South is stronger than it's ever been.

"There is no reason why we can't be right up there in amongst it all. If we can get a run going, then hopefully we can secure our position within the play-off places and take it from there.

"I'll be making sure that I can play my part in that; I've set the standard in terms of performance levels so I'll be aiming to maintain this and make an impact in each game.

"I am certainly looking forward to the challenge and playing in front of the FARMY ARMY is always a pleasure."

A home game against Cinderford Town took place earlier today as they sit just outside the top five.

We find out which players most influenced our Pitching In Southern League stars...

JOSH BOWLER (BERKHAMSTED) > MARK TYLER

I've been a Luton Town fan since I went to my first game at the age of seven. I used to like watching Mark Tyler play, he was such a good, reliable goalkeeper and influenced my game.

PLYMOUTH PARKWAY | HALL ON THE MARK

Callum Hall was able to add to his ever-growing collection of impressive goals last weekend with an absolute screamer to give Plymouth Parkway the lead against Swindon Supermarine.

The Pitching In Southern League Premier South outfit went on to lose this one 3-2, but in recent weeks Hall has grabbed winning goals against Basingstoke Town and Havant & Waterlooville. He was also on target with the opening goal in the 3-3 draw with Bracknell Town on Tuesday evening.

"It's always nice to score, but it's even sweeter when it's a banger," admitted Hall, who has already won our Goal of the Week accolade this season.

"Whilst I was buzzing with the goal on Saturday from outside the area, ultimately we weren't able to take any points from the game, which was disappointing.

"It's been a tough first half of the season for everyone involved here; there have been a lot of changes in and around the club, which haven't helped matters, but there have also been some positive signs too.

"Being such a young team has brought its own challenges but then you look at some of our recent results, such as beating Havant & Waterlooville and putting six past Gloucester City, and there are definitely some foundations on which we can build upon over the second half of the season.

"I am happy with the number of goals that I have been able to contribute. I am on eight at the moment, so the next target is to get into double figures and then get as many as I can beyond that to help lift the team out of the relegation zone.

"It's a very even League this season. There's only Merthyr Town that I've felt are a class above so far, every other team is capable of beating each other on their day.

"We know that as a group we have to start turning performances from games such as last Saturday, where we took the lead twice, into points. If you can't win then you have to make sure that you don't lose and by doing that we can keep adding to our points tally in order to work our way up the table."

The Devon club locked horns with Marlow earlier today.



BARTON ROVERS | FULL STEAM AHEAD

It's full steam ahead for Barton Rovers. Tuesday evening saw them move into third place in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central table following a 4-2 away win at local rivals, AFC Dunstable.

It represents a big climb for a team that has got themselves back on track after being bottom of the table during the early weeks of the campaign.

"We didn't start the season how we would have liked to," admitted summer signing, Markel Cousins. "We suffered a few heavy defeats early on, but it just shows the character that we have here.

"There are some strong personalities in the changing room and we've been able to bounce back and get into the position that we now find ourselves in." Cousins weighed in with two goals on Tuesday to help his side pick up a big three points.

"If we stay focussed and keep doing the things that are serving us well, I am sure the train will keep rolling on and who knows where it can take us!" Barton Rovers were in action at Leighton Town earlier this afternoon.
