The weather may have been wet and gloomy, but the action was hot across all four divisions.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South, leaders, Merthyr Town, were held to a I-I draw at Wimborne Town and with AFC Totton's clash at Taunton Town postponed, it gave the chasing pack the opportunity to close the gap.

Third-place Gloucester City grabbed the chance with both hands as they beat Winchester City 5-0, whilst Dorchester Town came from behind to get a rare win at Plymouth Parkway thanks to an Olaf Konzsela double in a 2-1 triumph.

Just inside the top five, in-form Walton & Hersham had to settle for a share of the spoils from a I-I home draw with Frome Town.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, Bedford Town remain top following a hard-earned 2-1 win at AFC Sudbury. Second-place AFC Telford United won by the same scoreline against Redditch United. Kettering Town won our Game of the Day at Stourbridge by three goals to one as Leiston moved into the play-off

places following victory over Spalding United.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, leaders, Yate Town, came from behind to win 3-1 at Thatcham Town. Exmouth Town got back into winning ways as they comfortably beat Bashley 3-0 with two more goals from Tom Bath to leapfrog Evesham United, who lost their local derby I-0 at Malvern Town, who themselves move just outside the play-off zone.

The big winners of the day were Bemerton Heath Harlequins who moved into the top five with an emphatic 7-0 victory over Bristol Manor Farm. Olly Balmer (pictured) helped himself to a hat-trick. One place above them, Mousehole had to settle for a point from a goalless draw at Tayistock AFC.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, it was a good day for leaders, Real Bedford as not only did they beat Enfield 3-1, but they also saw Berkhamsted concede a late equaliser to draw I-I with Barton Rovers, who sit fifth.

Hadley had a comfortable 4-0 victory over Northwood to strengthen their position within the play-off places as Flackwell Heath were without a game.

The first talking point came with around ten minutes to go until half-time when Charlie Lewis was dismissed for the home side.



STOURBRIDGE | LIFE BEGINS

They say that life begins at 40. Well, Tyrone Barnett reaches that age later this year and after the way in which he has started his Stourbridge career, there is plenty for the Glassboys' faithful to look forward to.

His goal in last weekend's 4-1 victory at Biggleswade Town was already his fourth in February in all competitions.

"I am pleased with the way in which I have settled in here," he told us. "As a striker, an early goal or two always helps you settle down regardless of how experienced you are.

"I must say that the Gaffer [Liam McDonald] and the rest of the lads have been a joy. They have welcomed me into the group with open arms. I have been around a lot of dressing rooms in my time but it always makes a massive difference when you are treated so warmly by everyone and that has certainly been the case here.

"I spoke with Batch [Richard Batchelor] initially about coming here and then when I spoke to the Gaffer he could see what I could bring to the team and it all happened pretty quickly after that! I've not looked back since.

"To score four in my last three games has given me a massive boost. As I say, us strikers are judged initially by the amount of goals we score so it's nice to be able to make such a favourable first impression on the fans here and hopefully I can really kick-on from here with them right behind me.

"I feel that I still have a lot to offer as a player; yes, I've got years and years of experience behind me, but the proof of the pudding is in the eating and if I can help this club achieve promotion, that will be fantastic.

"I did it with Leamington last season, so that experience alone will be most beneficial for the challenges that lie ahead over the coming weeks. "You only have to look at the League table and the recent results and it's still very much anyone's for the taking this season. No-one is running away with it and if we can put a run of wins together, who knows?

"Being involved in this really means the world to me; it's my therapy and my pride and joy. To be out there battling for points, you can't beat it. I've still got such passion for the game and that drives me on to continue playing.

"Coming here has given me another new lease of life and I am so determined to do well for the club and also myself. There is a lot of football left in these legs and – hopefully – plenty of goals too!"

The in-form Glassboys played host to Kettering Town this afternoon.



WALTON & HERSHAM | THE HIGH LIFE

High energy and high intelligence. That's the philosophy of Walton & Hersham manager, Billy Rowley, and it's certainly paying off for his young side.

Tuesday's stoppage time victory at Chertsey Town was their fourth Pitching In Southern League Premier South win in a row as they reached the 50-point mark, sat just inside the top five.

It was also the sixth time they have scored in the 90th minute or beyond in their last seven League games!

"It was a solid away performance on Tuesday evening," said Rowley, whose own coaching journey has seen him involved with the development and academy set-ups of Chelsea, Millwall and Fulham. "There wasn't a lot in the game; the pitch was heavy, our hosts sat in and were hard to break down which meant that there were restricted chances at either end.

"We kept going, as has been the hallmark of our recent displays, and got our reward with a well-taken stoppage time goal to make it 2-1 and give us our fourth successive victory.

"In my view, the main factor behind this run is our team spirit. On paper we've got one of the youngest teams not only in this League but throughout the Southern League and it took us a while to get to grips with the style and challenges in the early weeks of the season.

"But it's been a learning process and our hard work is starting to pay dividends. We've also had that bit of luck along the way with things dropping for us, which all teams need from time to time and, of course, the ability to keep going until the bitter end.

"The players have a lot of confidence right now and they can't wait for each game to come around."

Rowley took over at the helm initially on an interim basis towards the end of last term before landing the role on a permanent basis ahead of the current campaign. His ability to work with and nurture emerging young talent has served him and the club well over the course of the season.

"The Premier South has not surprised me this season, it's been exactly as I expected it to be," he admitted. "There are some extremely talented footballers involved and this, combined with the travelling and some of the pitches that we encounter, makes for a tough challenge.

"We currently sit in the top five and now we're looking forward to what the run-in has in store for us. The team is in a good place; confidence is high and we're ready for whatever comes our way. We'll take it game-by-game and hopefully get to where we want to be.

"Obviously when you find yourself in the play-off places at this stage of the season, you want to stay there. It's my job to ensure that these young players keep their feet on the ground and finish as high as we possibly can within the top five.

"I thoroughly enjoy working with young players and helping them grow and develop into footballers.

"We have a possession-based style here; it's high energy stuff with plenty of movement on the pitch. I want highly intelligent players who are adaptable and give their all. "The lads are giving me that at the moment and hopefully we can continue moving forward together and adding to our momentum."

This afternoon Rowley's side were at home to Frome Town.

"I just want to help the club push on from here and be part of the exciting journey that lies ahead."

BEACONSFIELD TOWN | MAKING MOVES

It's fair to say that it has been a season of transition for Beaconsfield Town. Relegated at the end of last term from the Premier South, they began life in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central this term with a completely new look and youthful team.

Further change came during the autumn when manager, Garry Haylock, decided to step down and was replaced by his assistant, Sam Togwell.

It's only now, as we enter the second half of the season, that the team is started to get into its stride, with Saturday's 3-1 victory over Hertford Town making it four League games unbeaten as well as victory over Wycombe Wanderers in the quarter-final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup last month.

"This is such a competitive League with a lot of strong teams and so much talent. It's no surprise to see players getting moves higher up the ladder from this League recently.

"Every game is a challenge and you can't afford to take any opponent lightly. It means that standards have to be kept consistently high in order to get the right results and we've started to do that in recent weeks.

"We're gradually moving up the table and hopefully this will continue in the weeks ahead. I just want to keep contributing with goals and good performances so we can finish as high up the table as possible."
