REAL ROUT

The Pitching In Southern League Premier South sees AFC Totton, many people's pre-season favourites, sitting pretty on top as they won for the fourth game in a row with a 3-1 triumph over Hungerford Town as Tony Lee weighed in with a brace.

Late goals denied Basingstoke Town victory at Gosport Borough as they had to settle for a share of the spoils in the end from an entertaining 3-3 draw, whilst Walton & Hersham were amongst the goals once more, hitting four without replay at Wimborne Town.

There were first wins of the season for Dorchester Town, who had Tom Killick back in the dug-out after illness, and Winchester City.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, no team has a 100% record after Stamford were held to a 2-2 draw at Bishop's Stortford, although they had to come from two goals down to earn their point. Our Game of the Day saw Redditch United secure a 2-1 win at local rivals, Stratford Town. It was a result which moved the Reds up to second place just ahead of Stourbridge who beat AFC Sudbury 2-0.



A 2-I victory gave Harborough Town their first Step 3 success as they overcame the challenge of Bedford Town. In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, Mousehole and Yate Town remain with 100% records. The Cornish club had goalkeeper, Olly Chenoweth to thank as he put in a Man of the Match display in their hard-earned 2-I victory over Malvern Town.

Meanwhile Yate Town left it late to secure the same scoreline at Bashley, who were playing at home for the first time. Lucas Tomlinson was the hero with the winner.

There were dramatic 3-3 draws at both Falmouth Town and Melksham Town with goals and red cards aplenty. In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, Real Bedford run riot against North Leigh, securing an 8-0 triumph, whilst Flackwell Heath won for the fourth game in a row as they brushed aside Leighton Town by three goals to nil.

Our Game of the Day at Berkhamsted lived up to its billing as they beat Welwyn Garden City 4-3. There was also some Isuzu FA Trophy Preliminary Round action today, we have details inside.

Stourbridge 2 AFC Sudbury 0



BROTHERS IN ARMS

It's a case of brothers in arms at Bashley where Steve and Dave Lewis are leading a revolution at the Pitching In Southern League Division One South club.

Both are successful businessmen in their own right and after Steve took over as Chairman in May, Dave, a former Bashley player, soon followed as manager.

"Our mum and dad split up when I was nine years old," recalled Steve Lewis, who turns 50 in September. "Dave, who's four years older than me, was a typical big brother and looked out for me.

"He was literally the hardest kid in secondary school, so when I joined, he was in the fifth year and no-one dared touch me! "We grew up in a working class family and really didn't have much money. I often wore hand-me-downs and there were tough

"Dad [Trevor Lewis] was the inspiration for both of us getting into football. He had been involved with Sholing FC in its various guises since the 1950s and is still Honourary President today.

"Both Dave and I have played for Sholing, a couple of times we were in the same team together, and when he played for Bashley, I would regularly attend games to watch him in action. I recall that during one of his spells at the club, he played under the legendary Jimmy Case.

"I looked up to Dave so much; he was the inspiration for me starting my own business at a young age. He started his own cleaning business when he was 18 and I knew from my early teens that I wanted to follow in his footsteps and start my own business. "I built my global business empire the hard way; I had little help and support, financially or otherwise, but through sheer hard work and determination, both Dave and I have succeeded in life and business.

"Our passion for football has remained and our affinity to the New Forest and Bashley FC drew us back here, although, I think rather than me choosing Bashley FC, the club chose me when the Chairmanship became available towards the end of last season!

"When Paul Lucas resigned earlier this year, the Executive Committee had a duty to find a new Chairman so that the future of the football club was safeguarded, and quickly.

"At the time, I was Chairman at Wessex League club, Totton & Eling FC, and I was firmly committed to my role there. I did have a very brief conversation with Bashley FC, but the message was that I would be happy to explore my options at the end of the season, once my commitments to Totton & Eling FC had finished.

"I genuinely believe that integrity in football is the vital ingredient any club official needs; I wasn't about to abandon the guys at Totton & Eling FC, in what was a very challenging season for them, in more ways than one. "As last season came to a close, the Bashley FC Executive Committee reached out to me again and after extremely positive discussions, it ended up being an easy decision to make to take on what is an exciting challenge here.

AYLESBURY UNITED | RISING HIGH

IFrom the Land of the Rising Sun has emerged a real rising star of the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central. 23 year-old Japanese striker, Morison Hashii, has been a driving force behind Aylesbury United's impressive start to their League campaign as he followed up his hattrick in the opening day 3-0 win at Biggleswade FC with the only goal in the I-0 triumph over Leverstock Green.

As a football mad youngster growing up in Japan, his talent was obvious and at 16 he headed to America on a University scholarship. Two years later and he embarked upon his professional career, which began in Dubai and then continued in Singapore before he came to the UK. "When I first came to England, I played for a Step 6 team called London Samurai Rovers," he told us. "They gave me a platform to show what I was capable of and I really enjoyed my football there.

"The goals flowed freely; I scored 75 in 40 games during my first season and it landed me a move to Basingstoke Town before I returned to Samurai and the goals continued.

"Now I have the chance to make my mark on Step 4 and I am really pleased with how things have started for me and team. "We've made the perfect start in the League with two wins in a row and no goals conceded. There are some talented players in this team who have the potential to really push on and do well in the game. "This is a good level; there are some strong teams and good players throughout the League. Our target is to win the title; you have to aim high and I want to make the supporters, my team-mates and the coach happy.

"From a personal point of view, I want to be the top scorer in this League. I am playing with a lot of confidence right now and four goals from two games is a good start!

"There is a long way to go, of course, but I am looking forward to what lies ahead this season."

"From a personal point of view, I was to be our top scorer again and help this club achieve its objectives and make a positive impact."

Experienced manager, Tom Killick, was expected to be back in the Dorchester Town dug-out today after missing the opening games due to illness which required a hospital stay.

Killick arrived at The Avenue Stadium in September following 20 years at the Poole Town helm and quickly stamped his authority on the team, using a tried and tested formula.

"I'm an old-fashioned manager who believes that, at this level of football, good recruitment and creating the right environment for the players to thrive in is by far the biggest factor in being successful," he told us. "Moving to Dorchester invigorated me, there is no doubt about that, and I am desperate to build on what we did last season and be successful for the players, supporters and those that run the club.

"The fans here have not had much to enjoy for a long time and I am determined to change that. I am realistic and know that I've not got lots of time left as a manager, so I want to make the most of it.

"Our target this season is promotion. If that's not the aim then it's pointless; I realise that people will say you should shy away from putting yourself and the players under pressure, but I'm not interested in that.

"It will be difficult, but we have to have ambition and I have a strong belief in this group of players.

"The League will be extremely competitive, with not much between the teams at the top and bottom.

"There are a lot of teams throwing huge resources at trying to achieve promotion and ultimately there are only two that can achieve it, so there will be a lot of disappointed teams and disgruntled owners!

"We finished last season strongly and I feel that we have recruited well, so hopefully we can be very competitive."

A home game against Gloucester City this afternoon is followed by Wednesday's trip to Winchester City.
