It's been another afternoon of cut-and-thrust across our four divisions.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South, the top five all won. Leaders, Merthyr Town, came from behind to win at Gosport Borough, whilst second-place AFC Totton chalked up a routine 2-0 triumph over Bracknell Town. Below them, Walton & Hersham overcame the challenge of Poole Town, Gloucester City swept aside Hanwell Town by five goals to nil and Dorchester Town battled out a hard-earned I-0 away win at Chertsey Town.

There was a big away win for Tiverton Town at Winchester City in the lower reaches of the table.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central and it's Halesowen Town who now sit pretty at the top following victory at Hitchin Town as AFC Telford United are hot on their heels following victory over AFC Sudbury.

Bedford Town salvaged a point at Redditch United with a stoppage time penalty as Kettering Town failed to find a way past Lowestoft Town in a goalless stalemate. Stamford move into the top five after beating Alvechurch 1-0.

The lead at the top of the Pitching In Southern League Division One South is down to just two points after Yate Town were held to a I-I home draw by ten-man Melksham Town and Evesham United won 2-I away at Falmouth Town.

Exmouth Town twice came from behind to beat Bristol Manor Farm 3-2 thanks to a stoppage time winner, whilst Mousehole also twice came from behind to hit a last-gasp leveller in a 2-2 draw at Didcot Town.

Entering the top five is Malvern Town after they battled out a 1-0 win at Cribbs and Bishops Cleeve lost at Willand Rovers

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, leaders, Real Bedford, now have over 100 League goals as they beat Northwood 5-0. Second-place Berkhamsted had to work hard to win 2-1 at Biggleswade FC.

There was a commanding victory for Flackwell Heath over play-off rivals, Hadley, as Thame United came from two goals down to triumph over Beaconsfield Town 3-2 and sit fifth on 60 points.

NEWS ROUND-UP

ST. IVES TOWN | HAPPY MUNDAY

It's certainly been a Happy Munday for St. Ives Town. Since signing teenage front-runner, George Munday, on loan from Cambridge United at the beginning of February, the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central outfit have embarked upon a run of seven League games without defeat.

Having scored the winner on his debut, Munday has gone on to bag six goals, including a dramatic late brace at the weekend to secure an impressive 3-2 victory at Kettering Town.

The impact of youngster is being felt throughout the team. "George has been outstanding," popular goalkeeper, Dan Wilks told us. "He's still a teenager and learning his trade, but since joining, he's led the line like a seasoned pro-converting when called upon and making a real difference for us.

"He's a young striker with all-around ability, versatile footwork, excellent hold-up play and the pace to get in behind. Initially, I was really impressed with his work-rate and his determination not to give up on lost causes, which has always benefited us.

"If he continues on this path, he will be an asset to any club, but we are able to reap the benefits at the moment."

Wilks is also a player who learned his trade within the professional ranks having been with Watford before heading north of the border to join St. Mirren. He then served Colchester United before embarking upon a successful career in the non-League game with the likes of Welling United, Dartford and Billericay Town, for whom he kept 18 clean sheets last season before joining St. Ives Town ahead of the current campaign.

Establishing himself between the posts, Wilks has watched the team grow as the season has progressed.

"At the start of the season we were naïve and didn't know how to close out games or stay in them to give ourselves a chance of earning a point or three," he admitted. "After a tough spell over the festive period, things have started to click into place since then and we've become hard to beat.

"The Gaffer has always supported us and believed that we could come out the other side and so it has proved. "With a few tweaks here and there, we've become a much tougher team to face, both defensively and in terms of character when it comes to making comebacks.

"We've drawn a lot of games recently, but as the saying goes, if you don't win, you don't lose and we've managed to do that.

"We're a very young side, which can be our undoing at times, but there is so much talent and ability throughout the team. I'd like to think that I've brought some stability and experience from the back — organising, managing the game and being there when called upon, whether by making saves or controlling the box and the space behind the back-line.

"This is my first season playing in this League, and it's exactly what I expected; physical, with a 'whatever it takes to win' mentality. It's less about tippy-tappy football and more about doing what's necessary to win. I've played in teams where we've tried to play pretty but haven't been effective; in this league, it's all about being effective to win.

"It's as unpredictable as any League I've played in. No team has been the same the second time we've faced them, and no team has managed to do the double over us, which is something to take pride in.

"We're unbeaten in our last seven games, and now we just need to convert those draws into wins to secure our spot for next season."

A home game against Bromsgrove Sporting took place earlier today.

POOLE TOWN | PITCH BATTLE

There aren't many player-groundsman operating in football, but we have one in the Pitching In Southern League Premier South where Poole Town's Josh Staunton combines cutting a solid figure in the heart of the back-line with cutting the grass.

The 29 year-old joined the Dolphins midway through last season, bringing with him the experience of over 200 games at National League level with the likes of Dagenham & Redbridge, Woking, FC Halifax Town, Yeovil Town and Boreham Wood.

"I can't imagine there's many player-groundsman in football generally, it's not really a particularly popular crossover," Staunton told us. "Loads of the other boys do different trades but I'm yet to come across anyone who looks after their own pitch they play on!

"After stepping away from full-time football, I was fortunate to look after a couple of other sports venues with my business and after discussions with the club they decided to give me a go here at Poole Town alongside my playing role.

"The pitch is doing well now. When I took over in September it wasn't in the best shape, and required plenty of hard work and attention, but I'm pleased to say it is still looking pretty good after coming through a very dull winter.

"We haven't had a game called off due to pitch this year, which after last year is a huge bonus and a massive step in the right direction for the club.

"I spend about ten hours a week on the pitch and each week looks very different; some weeks there is a lot of divoting and I always double cut for the nice chequered pattern for a matchday. "Fortunately, not many of the players probably know I do the pitch (until now!) and they probably wonder why I am repairing divots mid-game, but it makes my job slightly easier doing them as I go, in real-time, rather than doing it all afterwards!

"One thing I will say, all the travelling teams have been extremely respectful doing the start of their warm-ups off the pitch, which goes a long way towards maintaining the playing surface and I'm very grateful for that!"

There was much-needed joy on the pitch at the weekend where Poole Town ended a run of eight League games without a win with a dramatic 3-2 triumph over a Winchester City outfit that sit just above them in the table.

"The result on Saturday was huge for us," added Staunton. "It wasn't just the three points, but the manner in which we got them; scoring three goals and coming from behind whilst down to ten men is a real injection of belief and confidence in the group, which will be enormous for us in the run-in. "We played really well during the first half and had it not been a for a few good saves, we could have gone in at the break more than just one goal up. We then had a wobbly ten minutes at the start of the second half where we conceded twice to fall behind, but responded by showing the kind of intensity and level of performance that we need to get us out of the situation that we are in. "We have to be honest about the position we find ourselves in; the season has been majorly

"We have to be honest about the position we find ourselves in; the season has been majorly disappointing and we now have to find some consistent form to ensure that we can move out of the relegation places.

"Whilst the season has been disappointing, I have full belief in the squad and staff to steer the ship to safety and maintain our status in this League. We have been unfortunate at times, been on the wrong side of small details, which have cost us and knocked confidence as a result, and it's probably what has resulted in us finding ourselves where we are, but the last couple of results have been enormous for the club and I can really see the fire in the boys' eyes for the run in.

"The Premier South is very competitive. There are some fantastic players plying their trade at this level and some really good teams. I am regularly astonished by the commitment the players have alongside full-time jobs and the quality they display each week.

"Coming out of full-time football, it's a different world. Playing part-time I would say is trickier in some ways with the work-life-football balance and there are some terrific footballers at this level, which makes for good viewing and some fascinating games every week!

"I am not setting any targets for anything personal between now and the end of the season, the only thing that matters is the 18 boys in that dressing room find enough points to ensure that Poole Town retains its Step 3 status.

"That is the sole focus of myself and the group; amass enough points in the next eight games to finish outside of the bottom four, whatever it takes we will drive one another to achieve our goal."

Poole Town were at Walton & Hersham earlier today.

CINDERFORD TOWN | PIECES OF EIGHT

It takes a special kind of commitment to do a near 450-mile round trip on a Tuesday evening, even more so when you are bottom of the table.

But to then chalk up a resounding 8-2 away win makes it extra special.

That was the case for Cinderford Town as they secured a morale-boosting victory at Helston Athletic, with leading scorer, Alex Bonthron, helping himself to five of the goals.

The Foresters remain bottom of the Pitching In Southern League Division One South table, but with games in hand over those clubs above them and further games against teams in and around them in the table coming up, they have given themselves a lifeline with this impressive result.

"It was a long day, but the performance and three points made it all worthwhile," Bonthron told us. "It took us over four hours to get there and then we absolutely worked our socks off for the full 90 minutes, so credit to the lads.

"It made the journey home far more pleasant, although we were exhausted as we gave everything out there! "It's always nice to get a few goals to help the team win, but to score five was a real bonus; I certainly enjoyed it out there and didn't want the game to end!

"The result will give us a massive boost for the run-in and fingers crossed we can build on it now. At this stage of the season it's all about picking up points, by whatever means. We know that we're not going to score eight every game, of course, but we have to use this to get on a run of positive results.

"Every game becomes bigger than the last and I am really looking forward to the run-in. On our day we can be more than a match for anyone in this League, so it's about digging deep and doing all we can to keep this club at Step 4"

Bonthron arrived 12 games into the season having swapped life in the JD Cymru South, where he was a regular on the scoresheet and a Golden Boot winner, and despite the team's struggles at the foot of the table, he has contributed with a regular flow of goals.

"When I first arrived, I knew it was going to be a tough challenge," he admitted. "But I settled in quickly here and the goals soon followed.

"However, it counts for very little if we can't get the job done and move out of the relegation places.

"As I say, we know that we're good enough, we just have to be able to put a run together and prove it on a consistent basis rather than a game here and there. "Getting five goals on Tuesday has given me an added boost and I'll be looking to take that into Saturday's game, which is another massive one away at a Tavistock AFC outfit who are down there battling with us and have also seen a bit of an upturn in their recent fortunes.

"After that we're at home to Thatcham Town, who are currently one place above us, so these next couple of matches are going to have a big say in the direction we are heading."

"From a personal point of view, I'm definitely happy with how things have been going lately. I've managed to get a few goals along the way and also seven goal assists from the last 12 games, so I am happy with those stats, but there is always room for improvement.

"I've been focusing on my individual role and doing everything I can to contribute to the overall success of the team.

"There have been ups and downs since I arrived in late November, but things have been going well and moving in the right direction, which is what it's all about.

"We're in a really competitive League and there is quality in every team. It's challenging but at the same time exciting. All we can do is control what we are able to control and take it one step at a time.

"We're can't change what is happening elsewhere, so we just have to ensure that our own house is in order and see where it takes us.

"The main aim is to maintain these high standards that we've set and just keep performing well and giving a good account of ourselves.

"We have our targets and we'll continue to strive to achieve them in these final weeks of the season. Hopefully I can stay consistent in my performances and as a team we all stay aligned to continue this run that we are on."

The latest test came with a trip to Kings Langley earlier today.
