The month of February commenced with plenty of great action throughout our four divisions.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South, leaders, Merthyr Town, were made to work hard for their three points at bottom of the table, Marlow, where recent arrival, Cawley Cox's goal proved to be the difference. Just behind them, Gloucester City and AFC Totton couldn't be separated in a goalless draw, whilst fourth-placed Dorchester Town saw their game at Hanwell Town postponed due to a waterlogged pitch. Walton & Hersham remain fifth after they beat Winchester City 4-2 in a game which saw them let a two-goal lead slip. Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central and it's looking extremely close. Leaders AFC Telford United were held at home by Harborough Town as Bedford Town nicked a 1-0 win at Barwell to join them on the 50-point mark.

Just a point behind them, Stratford Town won at Lowestoft Town and Halesowen Town were commanding victors against Bishop's Stortford. Meanwhile Kettering Town got a stoppage time winner at AFC Sudbury. In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, leaders, Yate Town, came from behind to make a return to winning ways on Friday evening as they secured a 4-I success at Cribbs.

It was a result matched by second-placed Exmouth Town who beat Didcot Town to maintain their challenge. Just below them, Evesham United battled out a 1-0 triumph at Willand Rovers whilst Mousehole took a point at play-off hopefuls, Bemerton Heath Harlequins.

Bishops Cleeve remain in the final play-off spot despite seeing their game at Falmouth Town postponed. One place below them, Bristol Manor Farm had an emphatic 5-1 win at Westbury United with Louis Britton hitting a hat-trick. No question where to start in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central where leaders, Real Bedford, played out an amazing 5-5 draw with third-placed Flackwell Heath in a game that had absolutely everything. Berkhamsted in second place were unable to take advantage as they were held to a 1-1 draw at Ware, one of six draws in Division One Central this afternoon, showing just how competitive this League is!

The home side weren't behind for long as Joey Evans was able to restore parity only for Wiktor Makowski to put the visitors back in front with 25 minutes on the clock.


With half-an-hour gone it was 2-2 as Evans bagged a second goal for the hosts and then they went ahead for the first time through Ben Stevens on 36 minutes.

SHOLING | D-DAN IS THE MAN

There was another Mason family landmark to celebrate at Sholing FC last weekend when Daniel Mason, the youngest of four brothers who have all turned out for the club over the years, made his 600th appearance.

During that time, he has weighed in with an impressive 296 goals to make him the Pitching In Southern League Premier South club's all-time record scorer.

"It's a great achievement for sure," he told his club's media. "For me to be up there with some of the legends of this club is a great feeling.

"I can remember the early days of my time here, just being around the team and the dressing room was a big learning experience for me and now here I am, a decade later and with 600 appearances to my name, it's magical and something that I'll look back upon with a tremendous amount of pride when I hang up my boots."

Sholing were denied victory at Dorchester Town in Mason's 600th game by a stoppage time equaliser to make it five games without a win and leave them just above the bottom four going into today's big home game against Tiverton Town, who sit just a point below them.

"It's a transitional time for us," Mason added. "It's been frustrating at times because we know how good we are and how good we can be, but it's not translated into results.

"There's been a bigger turnover of players than we have previously been used to, but the feeling is that things are starting to settle down now and relationships are being formed all over the pitch. "We've got some good lads here and confidence is rising all of the time. We just need to keep working hard and the results will follow to get us moving up the table again.

"It's a big game at the weekend. As players we want to start repaying the fans for the faith that they continue to show in us. We're getting good numbers coming along to games, home and away, and we owe it to them to give them something to cheer about.

"As a group, if we continue showing the right attitude then the results will come, I have no doubt about that."

For the 32 year-old, the next landmark will be his 300th goal as he looks to further strengthen the Mason family legacy, which has seen brother; Byron, make over 700 appearances alongside Barry and Marlon who have also proudly worn the club colours. The Southern League would like to congratulate Daniel Mason on his achievement.



STOURBRIDGE | FRESH BATCH

In a bid to get his talented young team firing again, Stourbridge manager, Liam McDonald, has added a wealth of experience to his playing ranks with the recent capture of Richard Batchelor and Tyrone Barnett, combined age, 75 years young. The former Alvechurch duo have enjoyed long careers in the game and they both played their part as the Glassboys returned to winning ways at Harborough Town last weekend, ending the hosts' run of six straight victories in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central in the process.

For Batchelor it sees him reunited with manager McDonald and the rest of the coaching staff after they previously worked together with such success at Rushall Olympic, taking the Walsall-based club to promotion into the Vanarama National League North at the end of 2022/23.

"It's great to be back with Liam and the rest of the management team," Batchelor told us. "As soon as I found out about his interest in bringing me here, I knew straight away in my heart that this is where I wanted to be.

"I have known the Gaffer as a friend and a manager for a long time now; we have a good understanding and relationship.

"I've had a couple of training sessions and I knew all about the detail, intensity and quality that goes into them. It was interesting to see how the other players adapt to it; there is some good young talent here, it just needs one or two extra experienced heads amongst it, which is what Tyrone and I will provide.

"The victory at Harborough Town was a good indication of the type of squad we have; that blend of youth and experienced served us well on the day and secured a big result.

"Confidence plays a massive part in football; it was a solid and resilient performance and as the game went on, you could really see our belief coming through. Having the experience of Tyrone and I out there amongst them lifted the morale and as a group we managed the game well.

"All I ever do is try to give 100% in whatever position or role I am asked to play. I was happy with my performance at the weekend, but I know that I will get better as I get fitter.

"This is a good club; the infrastructure is all in place to achieve our goals. I want success and I believe that I can achieve it here. If I didn't truly believe that I would not have joined the club, it's as simple as that.

"I feel that I can bring a lot to this group both on and off the pitch. I've always been seen as a big character, willing to help the younger lads and hopefully they will know that they can come to me for any advice.

"This League is still wide open. On any given day, any team is capable of beating each other regardless of their position in the table. Consistency is key; any team who achieves that will win the League.

"I am a winner. I set my sights high and whilst I might not always win, I give it everything I have and that's all you can do. I try to give my team-mates the same mindset as myself and if we can do that, we won't be too far away with this team."

The Glassboys will be looking for an upturn in their home form today as they play host to Hitchin Town.



HAS SOUTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE SCORED THE BEST GOAL IN THE WORLD? MALVERN TOWN | BOOTS BACK ON

With over 130 Football League appearances to his name, Ryan Brunt brought his playing career to an end just over four years ago... or so he thought!

The 31 year-old cut his football teeth within the youth ranks at Bristol City before

end of the season.



After dropping into the non-League game, firstly with Bath City and then Chippenham Town, he decided to call time on his playing career in October 2020 at the age of just 27 due to increased work and family commitments.

However, a recent change in circumstances has meant that he has decided to put the boots back on, signing for Pitching In Southern League Division One South outfit, Malvern Town, and making his debut with a cameo appearance in The Hillsiders' commanding 3-0 victory at League leaders, Yate Town, last weekend.

"It's something that I have been talking about with Tums [Malvern Town player, Joe Tumelty] for a while now," he admitted. "Just after Christmas things fell into place where I had a little bit more time and flexibility in my life to get back involved, so I thought 'why not'?

"The Gaffers, Lee Hooper and Stephen Cleal, were good enough to let me come and train with the team and, to be honest, I felt a bit sharper than I thought I would be! "So we agreed quite quickly to get me involved here and I must say that I have been made to feel so welcome from the moment I first walked through the door. "I just hope that I can add some value and experience to the team for the run-in to the

"It was nice to get back out there on the pitch again on Saturday for the first time in over four years. My own contribution was short and sweet towards the end when we already had the game won, but it was just nice to be involved again. It was a good feeling!

"As for the game itself, it was a fantastic performance and victory over strong opponents with lots of experience and quality in their ranks.

"They are on course to win the League, but from start to finish we were impressive and it showed what it meant to everyone at the end. There's such a great bond between the players, staff and supporters."

So what qualities does the Birmingham-born front-man feel that he will bring to the team?

"I bring a presence up front," he said. "I'm an old-fashioned target man, I guess. I'm a team player that will help in both boxes... and hopefully I can add some goals to that too!

"I am looking forward to being involved in this League because there is some good quality within it. We're lucky enough to have a great 4G pitch, so the quality of the games will change from week-to-week depending on the pitches that we play on. "I've been very impressed so far by the quality and intensity of training. That definitely comes from the enthusiasm and dedication of [Head of Coaching] Andy Bevan alongside the co-managers."

We ended by talking aims and targets between now and the end of the season. "From a personal point of view, it's to get as fit as possible and try and contribute to the team as much as I can," he replied. "As a team, we'll be trying to secure a play-off spot; we have a good enough squad to do so, as was proved on Saturday, and with the current run of form, anything is possible."

Having seen Tuesday evening's game at Falmouth Town fall victim of the wet weather, Malvern Town were back in home action earlier today against Helston Athletic.
