SPRING IS HERE!



The sun was shining and spring was in the air across our four divisions this afternoon and there was plenty of good action.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South, the top of the table clash between AFC Totton and Merthyr Town ended all-square at 1-1 before a crowd of over 2,000.

Just below them Gloucester City were unable to make up any ground as they let a lead slip to lose 2-1 at home to Walton & Hersham, who now sit fourth, three points behind them. That's because Dorchester Town conceded a stoppage time equaliser at Taunton Town to draw 1-1.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, leaders, Bedford Town, had to show patience against Alvechurch as they grabbed a stoppage time winner. Meanwhile second-placed AFC Telford United came from two goals down to draw 2-2 at St. Ives Town.

There was a good 2-0 away win for Kettering Town at Leiston, whilst Halesowen Town left it late to beat Biggleswade Town as Stratford Town were held at home by Hitchin Town.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, leaders, Yate Town, came from behind to beat Shaftesbury 3-1. Behind them, Evesham United were held to a draw by Helston Athletic as Mousehole left it late to beat fellow play-off hopefuls, Bishops Cleeve. The visitors took the lead but eventually succumbed to a last minute penalty.

Also suffering at the hands of a last-gasp goal was Exmouth Town as they went down at home to Westbury United. Didcot Town's game was abandoned due to a medical emergency and the club has since confirmed that the supporter involved sadly passed away. The condolences of the Southern League go to the club and the family and friends of the deceased.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, Berkhamsted went level on points with leaders, Real Bedford, who were without a game, thanks to a 3-0 win at Leverstock Green.

Barton Rovers battled out a 1-0 away win at Kings Langley. Our Game of the Day ended 4-4 between Thame United and Hadley, whilst Flackwell Heath won 3-0 against Biggleswade FC.

AFC Totton 1 Merthyr Town 1

The deadlock was finally broken in this top of the table clash when Ricardo Rees put the away team ahead in the opening exchanges of the second half. With the clock ticking down, Scott Rendell equalised as both sides took a share of the spoils in front of a crowd of over 2,000.

Bracknell Town 1 Plymouth Parkway 3

The visitors took the lead courtesy of a goal from recent arrival, Reece Thomson, in the opening exchanges. The equaliser came from Dan Roberts just before the half-hour mark but the away team were back in front in the 60th minute when Liam Oakes finished off a neat move and then ten minutes later, Tylor Love-Holmes added a third goal. There was a sour note for the visitors late on when Shane White saw red for his second yellow, but it was the hosts who were left feeling blue at the end.

Gloucester City 1 Walton & Hersham 2

The opening goal arrived ten minutes into the second half as Ed Williams set the hosts on their way. Midway through the second period and parity was restored courtesy of Dawid Rogalski, who then went on to score the winner late on as his side turned the scoreline on its head.

Gosport Borough 0 Chertsey Town 2

There was a familiar name on the scoresheet when Michael Folivi put the home side in front and the lead was doubled three minutes into first half stoppage time by Romoluwa Akinola. The second period started as the first had ended with Akinola getting his name on the scoresheet.

It was proving to be one of those days for the visitors who had Ramarni Medford-Smith and Curtis Angell sent off. As the clock ticked down, Max Bustamante MacAire weighed in with a fourth goal for the hosts and that's how it remained.



Taunton Town 1 Dorchester Town 1

It was first blood for the visitors when Olaf Konzela opened the scoring on the half-hour mark.

With 60 minutes on the clock, Oliver Haste was sent off for the away team and as they battled hard to hold on to their lead, their resistance was broken in stoppage time as Jack Rice-Lethaby levelled things up as both sides took a share of the spoils.

Tiverton Town 0 Basingstoke Town 5

A goal from Liam Ferdinand with just eight minutes on the clock put the away team in command and they were able to build on it as Ben Cook served up a second just before the quarter-hour mark.

It was 3-0 with just 18 minutes on the clock when Sam Deadfield added to the tally for the visitors and then right on half-time, Ferdinand notched his second of the afternoon to give his side a four-goal advantage going into the second period.

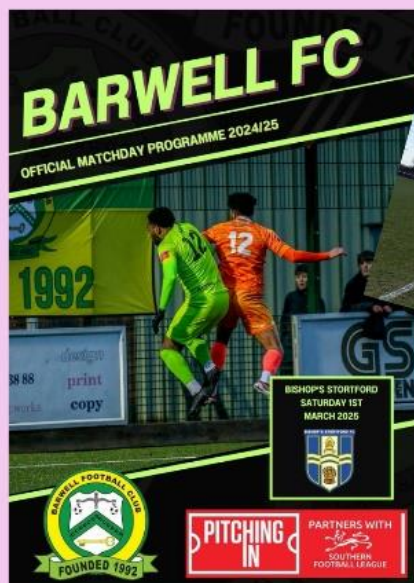
Biggleswade Town 0 Halesowen Town 1

The home side were chomping at the bit to return to action and they burst out of the blocks here with Ruin Wilson giving them an early lead.

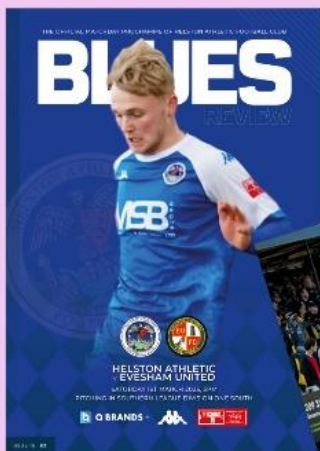
A second goal arrived just before the half-hour mark as Freddie Start-Walter found the net.

Thattham Town 1 Melksham Town 1

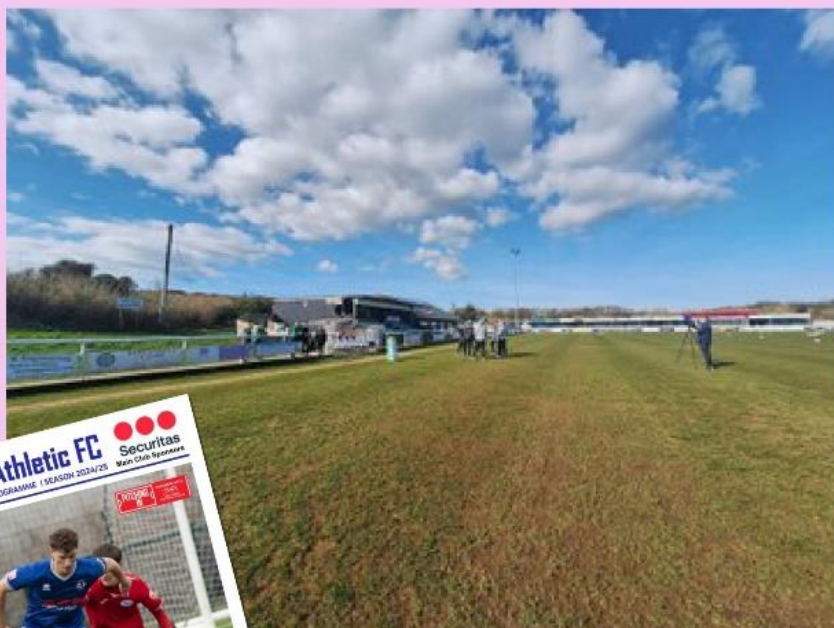
This was the day's early kick-off and it didn't take the visitors long to get their noses in front when Henry Sady fired home with just two minutes on the clock.

NEWS ROUND-UP

STRATFORD TOWN | OUT OF THIS WORLD

The planets are aligned this week as seven of them - Mars, Jupiter, Uranus, Venus, Neptune, Mercury, and Saturn – are all briefly visible in the evening sky, something that will not happen again until 2040.

It was with this backdrop that Lewis Ludford-Ison produced an out of this world hat-trick on Tuesday evening to give Stratford Town a 3-0 victory over AFC Sudbury in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central.

Each of his goals was packed with star quality. The first came early on when he found space to finish off a well-worked corner routine, his second was a classic bicycle kick, perfectly executed, and then the encore, in the final minute, a lob from the halfway line.

It was a perfect way to complete a first-ever senior hat-trick for Ludford-Ison and secure The Bards their fourth straight home win to strengthen their position within the leading pack, just three points off top spot.

“It was such a proud night for me,” Ludford-Ison told us. “Not only was it my first hat-trick in senior football, but to do it in that fashion was a fantastic feeling - I was over the moon!”

“First and foremost, it was a huge three points for us and a deserved victory. We’ve turned our home form around this season, that was our fourth consecutive win here and with two more home games on the horizon in quick succession on Saturday-Tuesday, we have to keep this form going now.

“The boys are buzzing; there’s a great atmosphere around the place, but, of course, we can’t get too carried away and just have to keep taking it one game at a time.

“As for myself, this hat-trick has given me a massive confidence boost. I was really pleased with the goals; the first finished off something that we’ve been working on in training, whilst for the second it’s always nice to see those overhead kicks go in; I tried one in the previous game and the lads said; ‘what are you doing?’ – I knew that this time if I tried to head it, it probably wouldn’t have gone in.

“Then for the third goal, I’d noticed the ‘keeper high off his line all game and just thought I’d try my luck and it went in like a rocket!

“Hopefully we can build on this now. Our ultimate aim is promotion and to be able to achieve that we have to stay humble and just keep doing the right things on a consistent basis.

“This League is a rollercoaster and extremely competitive, so it’s exciting to see how things will pan out.”

Lewis Ludford-Ison will be hoping that he doesn’t have to wait until 2040 to see his next hat-trick as he and his team-mates played host to Hitchin Town today in a game that has an impact at both ends of the table.



BISHOP'S STORTFORD | FEELING THE LOVE

Rashawn Scott is getting his love for the game back.

The 22 year-old, whose middle name is Rivaldo, was part of the youth set-up at Chelsea from an early age before moving on to Reading aged 18 and joining the Royals' U23 team. It was at the end of the 2022/23 season when the harsh reality of football hit home when he was released by the Berkshire club who were struggling on and off the pitch.

A trial spell at Derby County came to nothing as he drifted away from football for a spell before returning reinvigorated at Bishop's Stortford as they looked to get to grips with life in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central earlier this season.

“This season for me has been all about getting back into playing and loving the game,” he admitted to us. “I’ve been able to do that over the course of the season; there have been ups and downs for the team along the way but I am really enjoying being part of things here.

“We’re in a great place and with every game we’re pushing harder and harder to get the results which will keep moving us up the table.”

The Blues are currently on a four-game unbeaten League run and whilst three of those games have ended in draws, they are proving increasingly harder to beat.

Their last victory saw Scott contribute with a goal and Man of the Match performance as they beat Spalding United 2-0. He followed it up with another Man of the Match display at the weekend as they were denied victory over high-flying Stratford Town when their opponents snatched a last-gasp leveller.

“It was nice to get back on the scoresheet,” he continued. “The three points was the main thing, but getting a goal and picking up the Man of the Match accolade has given me plenty of extra motivation to keep working hard and pushing. I was happy with the way I played in the last game too, it’s just a shame we couldn’t see the game out and get the win.

“It really is a joy to play in this League; it can be tough and physical at times where you have to fight for the first and second balls, but there are also opportunities to get the ball down and play a bit too.

“I knew that this League would be highly competitive when I first arrived and so it has proved. Things are shaping up nicely at both ends of the table and I can’t wait to see how it ends. There’s not much between any of the teams to be honest.

“As a team, our aim is to keep pushing and get into the top half of the table and if I can keep giving my all with goals, assists and generally being effective, I will be happy.”

It’s a road trip to Barwell earlier today for Scott and his team-mates.
