The month of March came to an end with plenty of drama across our four divisions.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South, leaders, Merthyr Town, had another good day as their 3-I win at Winchester City was added to AFC Totton and Walton & Hersham being held to I-I home draws by Dorchester Town and Basingstoke Town respectively. The only other winner in the top five was Gloucester City, who beat in-form Tiverton Town by three goals to one on Friday evening.

At the bottom, Marlow were watched by Rio Ferdinand, but he couldn't inspire them as they suffered another defeat.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, Bedford Town are back on top after they won 2-0 at Leiston. Hot on their heels are AFC Telford United who had a commanding 3-0 triumph over Barwell. It was honours even between Harborough Town and Halesowen Town in our Game of the Day, whilst Kettering Town were denied victory at Stamford AFC by an equaliser deep into stoppage time.

Special mention to Spalding United who chalked up a 5-0 away win at Lowestoft Town.

It's a mouth-watering title race in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South where Yate Town's lead is now just one point after they were held to another home draw, this time by play-off hopefuls, Bemerton Heath Harlequins, whilst Evesham United battled out a I-0 away win at a Tavistock AFC outfit whose form has improved lately. Below them, Mousehole had a bad day at the office with a 3-0 defeat at Willand Rovers, whilst Bishops Cleeve occupy the last play-off spot after winning at Exmouth Town whose slide sees them out of the top five.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, leaders, Real Bedford, were in seventh heaven after a 7-I success against Beaconsfield Town.

With Berkhamsted not in action, third-place Flackwell Heath had to come from behind to beat Leverstock Green 3-1, Barton Rovers and Thame United battled out a goalless draw as Hadley slipped to defeat at Biggleswade FC. In the big battle at the bottom, Northwood chalked up an impressive 5-2 away win at Kidlington, a result which took them out of the relegation places and put their opponents in it.

And with that, there goes the month of March. Let's see what drama April will bring as the end of the season looms.

WALTON & HERSHAM | EXCITING TIMES

These are exciting times for Walton & Hersham as they battle it out amongst the front-runners in the Pitching In Southern League Premier South.

After agonisingly missing out on making the playoffs at the end of last term, the Swans were installed as one of the favourites for promotion going into the current campaign and they have certainly lived up to that billing since the turn of the year.

Following a 5-2 reverse at leaders, Merthyr Town, in their final game of 2024, the club has gone on a 14-game unbeaten League run that has included 11 wins to leave them sat in third place in the table with 70 points to their name.

Playing an integral role in this impressive form is front-man, Johl Powell.

He joined the club at the turn of 2024 and since then has contributed over 40 goals and assists in all competitions.

Now as the club prepares to face the final run-in to the end of the season, Powell has provided a timely boost with the news this week that he has agreed a new deal, which runs until May 2026.

"I am over the moon to sign this new deal," Powell told us. "As soon as it was offered to me, I had no doubts in signing it; I'm really enjoying being part of things here at a club that is making great progress and has an extremely bright future.

"This season has gone really well for me; there's no doubt that it's been by far the best of my career so far and I think that's down to the people around me. The management team and my team-mates have been fantastic and considering this was a new team put together over the summer, to be sat third in the table at this stage of the season is fantastic.

"As a group we're looking forward to the run-in. We go into it full of confidence and hopefully we'll be able to pick up as many points as possible to finish as high as we can to take our place in the play-offs.

"There are some good, strong teams battling it out at the top end of the table and we relish being part of such company and showing what we are capable of. Our goal is promotion, just like all of those teams around us, and we'll be doing everything we can to achieve it."

The capture of Powell on an extended deal has delighted manager, Billy Rowley, who added: "He is a top player for us and everyone involved with the club is delighted that he has agreed to extend his deal here.

"His character and determination is the embodiment of what we are all about as a club and exactly what we want – and need – in our team. "I first came across Johl as an Under-13 player at Millwall and even at that young age, his work ethic and eye for a goal were clearly evident. He's dedicated to his craft and takes his football extremely seriously.

"He is an absolute pleasure to work with."

"For his forthcoming 93rd Birthday he has just one wish and, typically, it's not about him, it's about the club that he holds so dear and has been the mainstay of his life. "He wants to see us achieve an attendance of over 1,000 for our home game against Flackwell Heath that day and to help make his dream become reality, we have decided to make it free admission for all!

"Yes, that's right, we're opening our doors and inviting you all to come along for free to help celebrate John's Birthday and create a special atmosphere in what will be a big game for us against opponents who are pushing for promotion.

"We had over 1,500 fans here for our FA Youth Cup fixture against Arsenal earlier this season and it was an occasion for which we were applauded by The FA for how well run the evening was, so our incredible volunteers, including John, are ready to make April 5th just as special."

We've left the last word for John himself.

HARBOROUGH TOWN | IN BLOOM

The battle for promotion and the play-off places in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central is nicely poised with just ten points separating the whole of the top nine clubs.

Tucked within that leading pack is Harborough Town who, it's fair to say, are enjoying their first taste of life at this level.

Having experienced an Emirates FA Cup adventure earlier in the campaign that took them to the second round proper and a trip to Reading, they now find themselves just inside the top five following Tuesday's draw at Bromsgrove Sporting, as they extended their unbeaten run to eight games.

"To be in the mix for a play-off place going into the final month of the season is really exciting," Luis Rose told us. "It wasn't all that long ago we were looking over our shoulder and worried about being dragged into a relegation battle, so it shows how quickly fortunes can change in this League.

"We've done really well to put ourselves into this position and now it's a case of taking it one game at a time and trying to not get too far ahead of ourselves because there are some big clubs battling it out with us to finish in the top five. "For us to be in this kind of company and still have everything to play for shows exactly how far we have come. We're just going to enjoy the run-in and look to extend the great form that we're on for as long as we possibly can.

"Saturday's 4-0 away win at Bishop's Stortford was a great result and performance. It's a tough place to go and, to be fair, we dominated the game from start to finish. We could have had things wrapped up by half-time but we were guilty of missing some good chances.

"However, we were a lot more clinical after the break and that was reflected in the final scoreline.

"As I say, we're taking it one game at a time, nothing is won or lost just yet. There will be twists and turns to come for most teams I think, so it's a case of accumulating as many points as we can and see where it takes us."

We ended by asking the 27 year-old, who has been with the club since October 2022, how he has enjoyed his first taste of life at Step 3.

"I didn't make the best of starts," he admitted. "It took me a little while to get to grips with the step up, but I feel that over the second half of the season I'm putting in performances that I am happy with.

"The same can be said of the team as a whole; we've grown together and got stronger and stronger as the season has progressed. Long may that continue now we're getting into the 'business end'!

"Hopefully I can play my part with goals and assists over these remaining games to end what has been a season that I will never forget on a high."



BIDEFORD AFC | JUST REWARDS

After 11 League games without a win, Bideford AFC were finally able to secure a big three points on Tuesday evening at Cribbs, a result which moved them further clear of the relegation zone in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South. On the mark with two of the goals in the 3-0 triumph was Finn Roberts and he was quick to point out that whilst it was their first taste of victory since January, they have proved to be hard to beat with seven of those 11 winless games ending in draws. "The thing is, we haven't been playing badly at all," Roberts told us. "It's been fine margins; the recent game against leaders, Yate Town, was a prime example of where we dominated for long periods but were unable to take our chances and then our opponents grabbed a share of the spoils.

"That's been the story of our season, so it was nice to see things come together with a commanding win and clean sheet on Tuesday. It didn't matter who scored, as long as we got those three points in the bag, but from a personal point of view, it was nice to score twice.

"The mood within the camp has remained positive. People have said, including the Gaffer who has been here for years, that we've played some of the best football that this club has seen in a long time during the course of this season.

"It just shows what a tough and competitive League it is. Every game is a test regardless of who the opposition are.

"In terms of my own form this season, it's been a reflection of last term in many ways. After a slow start I was able to find my feet and I've been happy with the way things have gone recently; I'm playing with confidence and making a contribution.

"I've enjoyed some of the football that we've been able to play. There's a real togetherness amongst the group and it will serve us well during what is a high-stake part of the season. Of course, we would have liked to have more points on the board, and we certainly deserve to have more, but we battle on and now we'll be looking to

add to our points tally when we head to Shaftesbury on Saturday.

"The focus is on ensuring that we have enough points to secure our place in this League for next season and then we'll take things from there."

The Robins now sit five points clear of the four relegation places with 42 points to their name from 35 games.
