FUN IN THE SUN



The sun was shining and throughout our four divisions there were battles taking place at both ends of the table. In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South it was an interesting day at the top as leaders, Merthyr Town, suffered a rare defeat at Hanwell Town, whilst second-placed AFC Totton won convincingly at Hungerford Town to go eight points behind with a game in hand. Walton & Hersham had to come from behind to beat in-form Wimborne Town, whilst a goal deep into stoppage time gave Gloucester City a 3-3 home draw with Dorchester Town, whose place in the top five is now taken by Havant & Waterlooville as they came from behind to beat Swindon Supermarine 3-2.

The Pitching In Southern League Premier Central remains as competitive as ever. Leaders, Bedford Town, and second-placed AFC Telford United were held to 1-1 home draws by Harborough Town and Spalding United respectively.

Also sharing the spoils were ten-man Halesowen Town, at St. Ives Town, and Kettering Town who scored two late goals to draw 2-2 at home to Hitchin Town. Stamford AFC sit fifth after they scored a stoppage time winner against Bishop's Stortford.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, it was a good day for leaders, Yate Town, as two second half strikes from Ross Stearn gave them a 2-0 win at Helston Athletic, whilst just behind them, Evesham United were held to a goalless home draw by Exmouth Town.

Just behind them, Mousehole thought they had beaten Bashley with a late goal, but the visitors levelled things up with just two minutes left on the clock, whilst Bishops Cleeve had to come from behind to beat Shaftesbury 3-1. Moving into the top five are Malvern Town as their impressive form continued with a commanding 3-0 triumph over Thatcham Town.

The big story in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central was that John Staines achieved his 93rd Birthday wish with over 1,000 present at Hertford Town to see them lose 6-4 to Flackwell Heath in a thoroughly entertaining game.

At the top, Real Bedford march on with a 4-I victory at Aylesbury United as Berkhamsted were held at home by Kidlington, who are involved in what is developing into a fascinating battle to avoid the drop. Elsewhere in the top five, Barton Rovers and Thame United both won to strengthen their positions.

Basingstoke Town 0 Gosport Borough I

Traffic issues meant that kick-off was delayed for this one and it took until the opening minute of the second half for Dan Wooden to give the visitors the lead. This was to prove to be the deciding moment in this one as the visitors took home all three points.

Frome Town 0 Chertsey Town I

The visitors went ahead as Oliver McCoy added to his ever-growing tally late in the opening period.

It proved to be the all-important goal as the visitors claimed all three points.

Gloucester City 3 Dorchester Town 3

NEWS ROUND-UP

WESTBURY UNITED | STRONG BONDS

It takes a special kind of resolve to be able to put together a competitive team on little or no budget. That's what has happened at Westbury United during a campaign in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South that has brought its fair share of challenges both on and off the pitch, yet going into the final month of the season, they sit tucked just inside the top ten. To then see the players embark upon a 370-mile round trip to Falmouth Town for a Tuesday evening fixture and put in a display full of grit, determination and commitment to bring home a point from a goalless draw, shows exactly what a special group co-managers, Ricky Hulbert and Lewis Porter, have at their disposal. Popular defender, Dan Restorick, is one such hero. He was up in the early hours of the morning on the day of the game to start work so that he could finish in time to make the minibus down to Cornwall.

"I worked 6am until 2pm on Tuesday so that I could leave work in time to make the journey," he told us. "It's a long old day; after playing a tough 90 minutes we then had the trip home and didn't get back until the early hours of the morning.

"I think it makes you work even harder on the pitch to make sure that you get something from the game and our performance on the night certainly warranted at least a point.

"It's all part of non-League football. If you want to play at this level, you have to deal with long away trips on a Tuesday night from time to time, it's a case of working your job and personal life around it.

"It's been a strange season for one reason or another. There have been things happen that are out of our control but the fact that 90% of the players opted to stick together and continue playing here for free speaks volumes for the spirit we have amongst the group.

"The job that the Gaffers have done is nothing short of incredible. To get us to where we are with no budget takes something really special.

"We had a tricky start to the season but then managed to put a decent run together. There was a little blip following our move to play home games at Frome Town, but since being back at Westbury, we've gone on to pick up some decent results recently.

"Personally, I am having one of my best-ever seasons. My confidence is high and I've also chipped in with a few goals as well, which is always nice.

"Having players around you that you can trust is such a massive thing and the issues that the club has had has only brought us even closer together and strengthened the bond.

"As a team we know that we're not going to pass opponents off the pitch, but what we are is big, strong and hard to break down.

"It's been very much an up and down division this year. Some of the teams that were down towards the bottom last season have been up there challenging this time around, including ourselves.

"It's a very competitive League and there's always something to play for; if you can get on a run of four or five wins it can make such a big difference.

"We've already beaten the record number of points that Westbury United have ever achieved at this level, so between now and the season we want to be able to add to that and finish as high up the table as we possibly can.

"A few more goals for myself would be nice too!"

BANBURY UNITED | NUMBERS GAME

It's fair to say that the Banbury United supporters have been starved of goals this season, at both ends of the field.

With 34 goals scored from their 37 Pitching In Southern League Premier Central games so far, they are the lowest scorers in the division. But by the same token, their record of just 33 conceded is easily the best in the division.

Therefore, it must have come as something of a shock to those hardy fans who made the long trip to Lowestoft Town on Tuesday evening to witness a seven-goal thriller, with five of the goals being scored by their team, including a hat-trick from Connor Stanley.

"It was a really positive performance," the experienced George Forsyth told us. "We started brightly and had done our homework on them, which is credit to the management staff. The Gaffer is very thorough in his preparation and that's why we are so difficult to break down. "I was delighted for Connor to get a hat-trick; he's a dream to play alongside. His ability is there for all to see, but he also does so much hard work for the team that can go unnoticed. I am so happy that he was finally able to get off the mark and I think that for the team as a whole, we were due a big win like this.

"Our defensive record is something that we are very proud of, but we know only too well that we don't score enough goals to go alongside it, so to get five on our travels on Tuesday was fantastic and long overdue.

"There is a really strong team environment here and a lot of the credit for that should go to skipper, Yaw Ofosu. I arrived here in November and felt comfortable straight away. Everyone knows their roles and responsibilities within the team structure and there is such a strong desire to keep the ball out of our net. It also helps that we have the best 'keeper in the League!

"This is such a crazy League. Look at how close things still are throughout and we're now into the final month. It's fine margins in almost all games; if we had a 20+ goal striker it would have made such a massive difference for us.

"We know that we haven't taken the points we should have done against the teams in the lower half of the table. Our points return against the top six has been very good; we try to play good football and dominate the ball."

So, with five games to go, what are the aims and targets?

"We just want to finish as high up the table as we possibly can," replied Forsyth. "We're unbeaten in five now and playing with freedom and confidence. I see no reason why we can't go on to get another positive return from these final five games.

"I've played every minute since I arrived at the club in November. I have so much trust and belief in the squad and manager and hopefully I can maintain the levels that I have set in these remaining games.

"It certainly helps when you know that the role you play within the team is appreciated and recognised by those around you."

Another player who joined the club part-way through the season and has contributed greatly to their defensive strength is Alex Prosser.

"The back five are so well-drilled," he added. "It starts from Jack Harding in goal and as a unit we are all committed and organised.

"It provides the team with a great base to build from. The energy and work-rate is there throughout the team and we've had encouraging signs recently that we can be an attacking threat too.

"Stanno [Connor Stanley] has been excellent since he joined us and his hat-trick on Tuesday will do him the power of good. It was such a good feeling to score five, although as a defender I was disappointed that we conceded two.

"But to finally see us get the rewards for the chances we create was really pleasing. We made a fast start, but credit to our hosts because they managed to get back in it, however, once we got back in front, we could have gone on to win by a bigger margin.

"With a bit more rub of the green, there's no reason why we can't take this forward now and give us something positive to take into next season."

Another road trip, this time to Leiston, took place earlier today.

NORTHWOOD | BACKING THE BEARDS

There's a hard-fought battle going on at both ends of the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central table as we enter the final month of the campaign. At the bottom, the fight to avoid the drop is set to be a real close shave but Northwood have benefitted from bearded heroes, Jack Smith and Jon Jo Bates, stepping up from their playing roles to take the helm following the recent resignation of Gary Meakin.

Their first game in charge saw them denied victory over play-off hopefuls, Barton Rovers, by an equaliser deep into stoppage time and then on Saturday they came away from a proverbial 'six-pointer' at Kidlington with a 5-2 success.

"Both myself and Jon Jo were asked to take the team and we took the role with open arms," Smith told us. "There was no hesitation whatsoever; we both care passionately about the club and we both agree that we shouldn't be struggling in the lower reaches of the table.

"We've got a strong squad here with plenty of ability and we've been able to keep them together whilst adding a few new faces here and there and it's been reflected with two great performances in our first couple of games.

"The boys have displayed a tremendous attitude and the team spirit is there for all to see. Four points and six goals scored from our first two games is very positive; all 16 players have played their part and given us everything so far:

"But it doesn't stop there and the nature of this stage of the season is that we have to be ready to go again, particularly after losing to Leverstock Green on Tuesday.

"We've only been in charge for just over a week but we've already learned a lot. Being in the dug-out is totally different to being a player; there is so much to do and think about, it's been a whirlwind, but both Jon Jo and I are up for this challenge.

"We're digging deep and the application of every single player has been top-drawer – we cannot fault their desire or efforts. There are six games to go and we need one big final push. It's about everyone working together on and off the pitch.

"This is such a competitive League with so many good teams and experienced players involved. I know from playing in it this season how tough every game is regardless of whether you are up against opponents from the top end of the table or those towards the hottom

"Of course there is pressure, but's that's why we play football. I'd also like to give a special shout-out to Mark, Rich and Saj, who have supported us with the warm ups. There are so many unsung heroes behind-thescenes who also deserve recognition."





YATE TOWN | STEARN FOCUS

With five games to go and their lead at the top of the Pitching In Southern League Division One South table now cut down to just one point, nothing is going to distract Ross Stearn from the task in hand.

The Yate Town front-man, who joined the club during the summer, recently chalked up his 600 senior appearance from a career that has seen him give sterling service to the likes of Weston super Mare, Bath City, Sutton United, Eastleigh, Chippenham Town and Taunton Town over the past decade.

"Not many players reach 600 games, so I am proud of the achievement," he said. "But right now my focus is firmly fixed on getting the job done and securing the title here at Yate.

"When the dust settles on the season, sure, it's something I will look back upon with great pride but for now there is work to be done and with just five games to go we're down to the nitty-gritty of the season.

"We've been at the top of the table for a long time and when that's the case, everyone is out to beat you and rightly so.

"We've earned that tag and now we've got to make sure that we get it over the line. Things are still very much in our hands, so it's down to us to go out there and win these remaining games.
