The final day of the regular season saw various matters settled across our four divisions.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South,
Dorchester Town confirmed the final play-off place as they
chalked up a dramatic 2-I win at Hungerford Town in a
game which saw them come from behind to snatch a
stoppage time winner. They pipped Havant & Waterlooville
whose 2-0 victory over Wimborne Town was not enough.
The final two relegation places were taken by Swindon
Supermarine, who lost 4-I at Walton & Hersham, and
Winchester City, who dropped into the bottom four after
they were held at home to Taunton Town and Tiverton
Town beat Marlow 3-2.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, Bedford Town took the title and a second successive promotion after beating Stourbridge 2-0. Congratulations to all involved!

The remaining play-off place went to Harborough Town who had an emphatic 5-I away win at AFC Sudbury. It was a bad day for Barwell as not only did they lose 7-I at home to Spalding United, it also confirmed their relegation alongside Biggleswade Town, Hitchin Town and Lowestoft Town.

The second title of the day still up for grabs went to Yate Town as they claimed the Pitching In Southern League Division One South crown following a hard-earned 1-0 victory over Didcot Town. Congratulations to all involved! The remaining two play-off spots were taken by Malvern Town, who came from behind to beat Willand Rovers 4-1, and Exmouth Town, who nicked it ahead of Mousehole, thanks to a 4-0 away triumph at Larkhall Athletic. Meanwhile Mousehole draw 2-2 at Melksham Town thanks to a stoppage time leveller but it was not enough.

At the bottom, Helston Athletic had their relegation place confirmed following a 2-2 draw with Bristol Manor Farm. In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, Hadley had their play-off spot rubber stamped even though they lost to a stoppage time goal at Leighton Town. The drama came at the bottom where a 3-I come-frombehind victory by Leverstock Green at AFC Dunstable saw them escape relegation at the expense of Kings Langley, who did not play today. They are relegated alongside North Leigh and Kidlington.

All play-off semi-final games across each of our four divisions will take place on Wednesday evening.

JOB DONE

It's 12 months since Merthyr Town agonisingly slipped out of the Pitching In Southern League Premier South play-off places on the final day of the season having been part of the leading pack throughout the campaign.

Rather than feel sorry for themselves and take the hangover into this season, they used the obvious disappointment to fuel a title challenge that has seen them lose just four League games, which has included over 100 goals scored and a record-breaking 32-game unbeaten run that stretched from the end of August to the beginning of April.

They held off a brave challenge from AFC Totton to confirm the title with a game to spare following a 3-0 victory over Hungerford Town on Bank Holiday Monday.

"To lead the club to the title is very special," beamed manager, Paul Michael. "To have achieved it with this special group of players and staff, who have built towards this over three years, is extra special. "I love watching the way these players play football and I'm delighted that they've been able to achieve the success they deserve. "Being title winners with Merthyr Town is extra special because of the club's supporters. On Monday there were generations of supporters all celebrating together and to be able to create memories for families, fathers and sons, mothers and daughters, husbands and wives, is really what made it so special. "There were a few defining moments along the way. Noah Smerdon's last minute headed equaliser against Gloucester City was key to keeping the unbeaten run going, Kiban Rai's stunning equaliser against Basingstoke Town similar, but I would have to say the games against AFC Totton were

the most defining.

Last weekend saw Merthyr Town clinch the Pitching In Southern League Premier South title. We sat down with manager, Paul Michael to discuss the season...

"In the first game we were in midst of a ridiculously tough set of fixtures against the other top teams but we came through unbeaten and in that home game against AFC Totton; we completely controlled the game and made all the running, in my opinion. I think psychologically the fact that it felt like they were worried far more about us than we were them and that it felt like they had come to survive that evening, that gave us the belief that we were the best team in the division and with it the motivation to kick on. "Then in the return fixture, credit to AFC Totton as they outplayed us, but Ricardo's wonder strike earned us a point and again it felt like after that, with points on the board for us, we were ahead of the game. That run of six wins and on draw (at AFC Totton) from the end of February and throughout March was the time that took us away from our rivals the stags. "It's been such a tough season with so many good teams. I think the top six are as strong as I've seen in a few seasons, there's so many talented players at this level now. There's been great banter between rival sets of supporters but I believe respect too, and that for me typifies the wonder of the Southern League.

"We've received so many kind messages from clubs, supporters and staff from around the league it's been fantastic. I personally have built good relationships with many of the managers at this level I'll miss being able to lean on some of them, share ideas and problem solve, I genuinely wish all the teams the best on the last day and next season.

MERTHYR TOWN | PAUL MICHAEL

I think the relegation battle typifies the strength of the league this year, it's going to the wire and someone with a points tally that would normally keep you up is going down. I also wish all the teams in the play-offs the best, but I'm so, so glad we're not in them with all the quality in there! "My personal highlight has to be the weekend just gone! Following consecutive defeats for the first time all season, losing at home for the first time all season, the end of the unbeaten run after 32 matches. the feeling of pressure hit us hard in the week leading up to Easter. But, we stuck to our principles, were quite forensic in our analysis, we were clear with the players what needed to change last weekend and the players responded with six points, six goals, two clean sheets and a league title! "The players were bang on in both games and I'm very proud of the work we put in as a staff to prepare the games and the way

the players responded, that's how champions respond to pressure. Then the memories of the celebrations at both games will live long in the memory.

"I knew the potential of this club as soon as I set foot in the place and I'm so proud to have a created another special moment for these people who have seen the club through so many tough times. I touched on the emotion that we saw from generations of supporters and that is what fills me with pride.

"Before the game I saw a number of posts about the last time Merthyr won promotion to this kind of level, it was then I realised that we wouldn't just be creating moments for the 3,000 or so that would be there on the day but for their children and grandchildren in the future to say, "my dad" or "my grandmother was at that game". There are also many supporters that are no longer with us that we know would be looking down with pride too and that was another aspect of the day not lost on our supporters, friends and families. I hope this is just the beginning of the special times we can create together.

"Now the preparations start for Step 2 and it's all very exciting. It's going to be a huge challenge with some of the resources and established clubs at that level but we're looking forward to it, and we quite like upsetting the odds as shown in us being 33-1 at the start of the season for the title, so let's see what we can do! Let's go on an adventure!"

NEWS | STEP 3 PLAY-OFF SEMI-FINALS AND FINAL TO BE LIVE STREAMED

The semi-finals and finals of all Step 3 Southern League, Isthmian League and Northern Premier League Play-Offs will be live streamed for the first time this season. This is part of a proposed collaboration between the Trident leagues and Ireland-based ClubberTV, the live streaming platform that gives subscribers access to exclusive live and on-demand sports coverage in Ireland.

By partnering with the Trident leagues, ClubberTV gains a foothold in the UK streaming market, whilst the Leagues tap into a new income source by rolling out streaming of selected fixtures across the four Step 3 divisions from next season. The viability of the wider project is currently being assessed.

For the Play-Offs, a one-off fee of just £10.99, will enable subscribers to view all the semi-finals and finals from this season's Step 3 Play-Offs between Tuesday 29th April and Monday 5th May.

In a joint statement, the chairs of the three leagues, Mark Harris, David Martin, and Nick Robinson said: "We are working with ClubberTV to assess the viability of live streaming selected Pitching In Step 3 fixtures from next season.

"Streaming the Play-Offs gives both ourselves and ClubberTV an ideal opportunity to show that the audience is there, and that the logistics involved work. If so, we hope to conclude negotiations with ClubberTV ahead of next season."

The move coincides with the completion of DAZN's second season as the National League's live streaming partner.

Jimmy Doyle the CEO of ClubberTV said: "We are thrilled to enter the UK market in partnership with the Pitching in Trident leagues. We are delighted to have the opportunity to showcase these games at scale to fans at home in the UK and those abroad.

"We see this as a logical extension of the great work we have been doing in the Irish market and look forward to bringing live and on demand access to UK football fans everywhere. Be sure to check us out on all the usual socials - @clubberfootball - for action clips and updates."




HALESOWEN TOWN | WINNING SMILE

Platt has painful memories of his early days at the club almost a decade ago.

"I remember having a good pre-season in 2015 and was going to start the first League game of the season as first choice," he recalled. "But then in the final pre-season game I had four teeth knocked out and so I had to miss the game.

"That really was the catalyst for my affinity to the club, though, because the fans rallied around to raise funds to help pay for the teeth that I had lost. Things like that you don't forget; to do that for a new player meant a lot to me.

"There have been so many happy memories over the years; the play-off game two seasons ago quickly springs to mind for obvious reasons. We were such a close-knit team and to achieve promotion together was really special.

"We have the chance to do something similar this season and we're really looking forward to what lies ahead over these next few weeks.

"As a team we've made massive progression this season. The Gaffer has done an amazing job to build a strong team and in my opinion, the squad is now the best it's been all season.

"We're in great form going into the play-offs and whilst we have kicked ourselves about the points we've dropped which mean we're now just out of the title race, it will all be forgotten if we can go up via the play-off route and that's where our focus is.

"On a personal note, it's been pretty much how I've done it throughout my career. I'm a steadyeddy type of goalkeeper with no fuss, just trying to perform seven out of ten in each and every game. I am happy with the way I have performed this season with as little mistakes as possible. "I can't wait to get stuck into the play-offs. We've got as good a chance as anyone; we've been solid defensively and we've got players higher up the pitch who can effect games in key moments, but, as everyone knows, anything can happen in the play-offs.

"Hopefully it will be our year and with the support that we have, it would be a great way to end the season, so bring it on!

"This has been another competitive season in the Premier Central. There's been no stand-out team and those in the bottom half of the table have been so much better than previously. The standard has improved massively over the past few seasons and that is testament to this level and how much more professional it has become.

"I think the fans can see that too and that's why the numbers attending games at this level are increasing all of the time. It's great to see.

"I'm really enjoying my football and I just want to do that for as long as I can at the highest level possible."

An away trip to play-off hopefuls, Stamford AFC, brought the regular season to a close earlier today for Platt and his team-mates.
