# SIX APPEAL

There was a limited number of games in the Pitching In Southern League Premier South and Central this afternoon due to the Emirates FA Cup, but there was no less drama.

In the Premier South, leaders, Merthyr Town roared to a 6-0 victory over Wimborne Town and in doing so, reached 30 League goals for the season so far. Ricardo Rees weighed in with four of the goals this afternoon. Meanwhile Sholing had an excellent 5-1 triumph over Havant & Waterlooville to move them up to just outside the top five, as Gloucester City's 1-0 away success at Tiverton Town puts them second on 20 points. Over in the Premier Central, Stratford Town came from 2-1 down with around five minutes to go, to win 3-2 at Halesowen Town as Lewis Wilson hit a dramatic stoppage time winner.

The local derby at Alvechurch went the way of visitors, Stourbridge, whilst Bedford Town won for the third time this week on their new surface as they moved up to second place in the early table.



There was drama in Division One South as Cinderford Town got their first points courtesy of a come-frombehind success at Westbury United.

Bristol Manor Farm hit five in a 5-1 triumph over Falmouth Town, whilst Bemerton Heath Harlequins came from 3-1 down to beat Malvern Town 4-3 and Mousehole overturned an early two-goal deficit to triumph 3-2 at Thatcham Town.

In Division One Central, Northwood got their first point with a 2-2 home draw with Leverstock Green.

At the top, Hadley remain unbeaten after they disposed of Berkhamsted 4-I and Flackwell Heath remain on their tails following a 2-0 triumph over Kidlington.

In the Emirates FA Cup third round qualifying, Harborough Town beat Learnington of the Vanarama National League North. Bishop's Stortford also disposed of higher level opponents as they beat Hereford and Gosport Borough won at Oxford City.

There was a hard-earned draw for Bishops Cleeve but narrow losses for Larkhall Athletic and Melksham Town.


A third goal arrived for the hosts just past the hour from Louis Brittion, who then went on to notch a fourth as the clock ticked down.

The second period saw both teams have chances to nick it, but it ended with the scores level.


#### Stotfold I Aylesbury United 0

# FAMILY VALUES

It's been quite a journey already for Bedford Town this season following their promotion back into the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central.

Forced to play and train away from their Eyrie home whilst redevelopment works took place on the pitch and floodlights to give them a community facility to be proud of, they have nevertheless made a solid start to life at the higher level with four wins from their opening nine League games to leave them sitting in seventh place in the early table.

Two of those victories have come over the past week in what has been a successful return to home action both on and off the pitch.

Last Saturday a crowd of almost 1,000 gathered to see them celebrate their homecoming with a 2-0 victory over a Redditch United outfit that made the playoffs last term and they followed it up with a dramatic 4-3 triumph over Leiston on Tuesday evening.

On that occasion, they recovered from conceding a last minute equaliser to go on and win the game in the 96th minute on a night of high drama with red cards, a penalty and plenty of talking points. The early weeks of the season have also brought tragedy with popular striker, Leon Lobjoit's baby daughter, Marnie Jaz Mae, passing away as the club and football community came together to offer its support.

It's at a time like this when the family ethos that manager, Lee Bircham, has installed into the club really comes to the fore. "It's been an incredibly difficult and emotional time for everyone at the club," Bircham told us. "Things like this put football and life firmly into perspective. I am extremely close to Leon and have felt the pain with him and for him.

"To see how the club and football community in general has come together to support him and his family has been truly humbling. It hits hard, especially as a parent myself, but it shows the strength of character that Leon has that he has played in our last two games.

"Being out there on the pitch is his release, his freedom, and to see him score the second goal against Redditch was emotional. He is so brave; I can't praise him enough and it shows how much he and his family are loved around the place.

"A close bond exists between everyone here and it's this which sees us through the bad times and makes the good times even more special because we are sharing them with people who mean so much to us.

#### **BEDFORD TOWN | LEE BIRCHAM**

"Last Saturday was a special day; to be back at home meant so much. Since pre-season we've played at different venues and for training we've also had no fixed abode, grabbing facilities as and where we can to be able to put on sessions.


"It's been very much a case of living week by week, but it's that sense of togetherness and team spirit that has seen us through. "The supporters have also stayed with us and last Saturday's performance was for them. To see so many people inside the ground, including the Mayor and other local dignitaries, it really did bring a lump to the throat.

"Looking around and seeing what a fantastic facility we now have and how it can impact the lives of so many people, it just makes me extremely proud to be manager of this football club.

"This investment in the infrastructure is not just for now, it's for future generations to benefit from and seeing so many youngsters affiliated to the club through our various youth teams and attending first-team matches to cheer us on, it all bodes well for the future.

"The 3G surface will allow all of our affiliated teams to have somewhere to call home, it will bring them even closer to the club and the benefits will be massive. That's why the club has made this investment; it extends our reach into the local community and it's the correct way to go about things to give us a sustainable and exciting future.

"The season so far has been amazing. It's been well-documented that we have a bottom three budget here and our target is to finish the season fifth from bottom, but fair play to the players because they have made a pleasing start in what is a tough League.

"We knew the standard would be high, you have to be right at it in every game to stand any chance because there is quality in every team that we come up against, both on the pitch and in the dug-out.

"The jump from Step 4 to Step 3 is huge; you saw it throughout the Leagues last season where a large proportion of the teams that got promoted out of Step 4 went straight back down again. The Premier Central is tougher than it has been for a while but we are loving it." Bircham's side were back in home action again this afternoon as they played host to AFC Sudbury.

#### **NEWS ROUND-UP**

#### **LEISTON | MILESTONE FOR SKIPPER**

When Seb Dunbar led Leiston out at Bedford Town for their Pitching In Southern League Premier Central encounter on Tuesday evening, it was his 400th appearance for the club. Spread over three spells since he first arrived in 2012, he has given the club sterling service and whilst they slipped to a stoppage time defeat in their last outing, the 32 year-old believes that both he and the team are starting to get into their stride following a frustrating start to the current campaign.

"I am very proud to reach this milestone," he told us. "I've played around 40 games a season, which at any level, is a good achievement.

"To still be playing regularly at Step 3 level is something that I am definitely pleased about. "If I'm being honest, when I made my debut for the club 12 years ago I didn't think that I would go on to make so many appearances for one club. I hoped that I would go on to have a decent career, of course, but players making this number of appearances for a single club is becoming increasingly rare in the modern game.

"I can remember my debut being fast and aggressive with the tackles flying in. As a young player fresh out of Academy football [with Ipswich Town], it was a shock to the system.

"My game has certainly improved in a lot of areas since then. I'd like to think that I've played to a high level throughout my time at Leiston and always given my all.

"The club has always overachieved and pushed on a lot, which is great. For such a small area and budget compared to most that we come up against in this League, we have done extremely well.

"This season has started slowly for me. I missed games at the start through injury, but I am back playing again and happy with my contribution so far. With more game time I'll get my match fitness levels back up to where they need to be and I'll keep improving.

"I think that as a team we are starting to find some rhythm now. We had a poor start, but results have started to pick up over the past month. There's a lot more to come from us and we will be up there at the right end of the table. "I do think that the Premier Central is the weakest it's been for a few years this season; a lot of the big clubs with big budgets have gone and it does make things more competitive with more teams have the chance to do well and make an impact.

"We are targeting a place in the play-offs and we'll be doing all we can to achieve that objective."

Attention turns to the Emirates FA Cup today with a third qualifying round home tie against Hornchurch.

#### WINCHESTER CITY | HOMECOMING

All of the blood, sweat and tears were worth it earlier this afternoon when Winchester City stepped out at their redeveloped Charters Community Stadium home for the first time.

An extensive programme of work has taken place at the Pitching In Southern League Premier South club, with a 3G playing surface laid, new LED floodlights installed, stand redevelopment and improvements of the surrounds with new fencing dug-outs and hard standing areas.

"This is a project that has been six or seven years in the making," Club Director, Stuart Munro, told us. "The current committee has taken it on and now we are about to see it finally come to fruition with our first competitive game, which is extremely exciting. "I am very proud of what has been achieved. There have been plenty of hurdles to overcome and we've had to jump through many hoops, but the ground grading inspection took place earlier this week and we are good to go!

"There are so many people who have played their part in getting us to this point and we are eternally grateful to them. Winchester City Council have also been extremely supportive and so too has the Football Foundation.

"This project is not just about the here-and-now, it's about building a sustainable future for the football club and reaching out to provide a first-class facility for the whole community.

"We have so many different teams affiliated to us already and we are now able to extend this even further and have an even greater reach within our local area. "We're already up to 85% capacity; the hope is that if we bring more members of the local community into the club via the various activities and teams that we offer, they will return to watch the first-team and that secondary spend, allied to getting new sponsors on board because the stadium will be in use every day, will then allow us to invest in continuing to build and develop the infrastructure of the club.

"There is a stand that we would like to redevelop as well as improvements to our hospitality facilities, so this is very much an ongoing project, which we intend to build over time."

The club has a mouth-watering game in which to open the new facilities as they take on Vanarama National League South outfit, Weymouth, in the third round qualifying of the Emirates FA Cup.

"Today's game is the first of four in a row here," added Munro. "We've got six home matches by the end of October, so this could be a turning point for us and see us start building some momentum to get our season up-and-running.

"We finished last season in the middle of the table, in 11th position, and we are confident that we can do the same again this time around and maybe get into that top ten. "This is an opportunity for us to really start moving forward both on and off the pitch. We're not going to try to run before we can walk, though. It will be done in a considered, controlled and sustainable manner."

#### HUNGERFORD TOWN | TURNING POINT

"I've never been involved in a game like that before," Jacob Bancroft told us. "To go a goal down within the opening couple of minutes but then hit back and score nine, it's something that will live long in my memory.

#### FLACKWELL HEATH | AIMING HIGH

Life is good for Flackwell Heath. They have taken the step up to the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central in their stride and last Saturday created some club history by reaching the third round qualifying of the Isuzu FA Trophy for the first-ever time.

Having secured the Combined Counties League Premier North Division title last term with just three defeats from 38 games, they have continued in a similar vein this time around, amassing five wins from their opening six League games, scoring an impressive 17 goals along the way.

They also bagged another six goals last weekend in the Isuzu FA Trophy as they brushed aside Broadbridge Heath to set up a mouth-watering home tie with Premier Central outfit, Bishop's Stortford in the next round.

There is plenty of confidence and belief running throughout the team, with the goalscoring exploits of Wiktor Makowski particularly catching the eye.

Arriving at the club midway through last term, the 21 year-old hit 15 goals in just 11 games as the club went on a nine-game winning run to secure the title.

"For us to start so well in the League and make history in the FA Trophy is fantastic. The club and supporters have given us so much and it's nice to be able to give back with our performances on the pitch.

"It's a journey that we are all on together and long may it continue because these are good days for us.

"We've set our sights on continuing the momentum carried over from last season. We're not slowing down, there is so much we want to achieve. Personally, somewhere between 40 and 50 goals would be nice, wouldn't it? You have to aim high and I always push myself to achieve things."
