It meant that AFC Totton were able to close the gap just behind them as they eventually ran out commanding 6-I winners against Marlow, although they didn't have things all their own way.

A late leveller earned Gloucester City their I 2th draw of the season at Basingstoke Town, whilst three goals in the final four minutes gave Dorchester Town a 4-I victory over Swindon Supermarine. There was also late drama at Havant & Waterloovile where Walton & Hersham nicked a 3-2 win in the last minute.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, Bedford Town are back in pole position following a commanding 3-0 triumph over Bromsgrove Sporting. Second-place Stratford Town won by the same scoreline against Royston Town as AFC Telford United were held at Bishop's Stortford.



In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, Bashley ended a difficult week with a 3-2 victory over Willand Rovers as they returned to action following a serious road traffic accident involving Jordan Chiedozie and physio, Reighan Taylor, on their way back from last weekend's game.

Leaders, Yate Town, were 2-I victors over Falmouth Town and in doing so ended their opponents' winning run. Exmouth Town slipped to a 2-I defeat at Shaftesbury, who grabbed the winner in stoppage time, meaning that Evesham United go second having beaten Melksham Town 2-0. Both Mousehole and Bishops Cleeve, who make up the rest of the top five, both had routine home wins.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, leaders, Real Bedford, overcame the challenge of Kidlington without too many problems as they won 3-0 away. Second-placed Berkhamsted were made to work hard for their 1-0 success against AFC Dunstable.

Meanwhile Flackwell Heath let a lead slip to go down 2-1 at fellow play-off hopefuls, Barton Rovers, who went back into the top five after Thame United lost at home to Bigglewade FC.


Kettering Town 3 Barwell 0

BASHLEY | SENDING SUPPORT

The football community has come together to offer its support to Bashley FC after their player, Jordan Chiedozie, and physio, Reighan Taylor, were involved in a serious road traffic accident on Saturday evening, as they travelled back from their Pitching In Southern League Division One South game at Tavistock AFC.

The car that they were travelling in suffered a blow out tyre, which forced them to pull over onto the hard shoulder of the M27. It was then that another vehicle collided into them, causing serious injury to Mr. Chiedozie, who also counts Dorchester Town, AFC Totton and Poole Town amongst his former clubs.

The Bashley players have set up a GoFundMe page which, at the time of writing, has seen almost £20,000 donated.

"We are overwhelmed with sadness and shock at what has happened," said manager, Dave Lewis, who has been a pillar of strength during what has been a traumatic week for the club. "The football fraternity has been brilliant and we've received so many nice and supportive messages. When something like this happens, you see the strength of the football community and it's been far-reaching and a source of real comfort.

"The money raised through the GoFundMe page has been fantastic, but it's not about the money, it's more a token of love and support for lordan.

"The Southern League kindly allowed us to postpone Tuesday's game and it gave us an opportunity to get together as a group and try to understand and come to terms with what has happened. It gave us the chance to get our emotions out there.

"It was sombre, but a good meeting as we all needed to get together. It also gave us chance to rally around Reighan. Thankfully she suffered no physical injury but despite the obvious trauma, she remained calm and concise to deal with the situation when it happened and call an ambulance, which arrived on the scene within minutes. She's an absolute hero."

The thoughts of the Southern League are with everyone who has been affected by this and we wish Jordan well on his long road to recovery. After some heartfelt deliberation, the Bashley players have decided to go ahead with today's game against Willand Rovers. Both the Southern League and the opposition were supportive with whatever decision the club made on this.

THAME UNITED | THE LATE SHOW

There was plenty of drama at Thame United on Tuesday evening as the home side came back from four goals down to draw 4-4 with Stotfold in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central.

The visitors raced into a two-goal lead within the opening ten minutes and when they bagged a fourth goal on the hour-mark, it looked like game over.

But within two minutes of the fourth goal going in, the evergreen Jefferson Louis had reduced the arrears before a frantic final eight minutes saw the hosts score three times, with the equaliser coming deep into stoppage time courtesy of substitute, Curtis Brown.

The late drama followed on from Saturday's game where an 89th minute goal from Finlay Murray gave them a 2-1 triumph at Hertford Town.

"But we got a second goal with around eight minutes to go and it just galvanised us. Everyone dug in and played their part, it was as if a wave of belief just came over us and carried us through.

"Coming off the bench, you always hope to make an impact, so to play my part in the comeback and get the equaliser right at the death was a great feeling.

"As a group I feel that we've exceeded expectations this season. We've reached the 50-point mark and sit just inside the play-off places. There's a lot of work still to be done to be able to secure our place in the top five, we know that.
