Top scorers were Havant & Waterlooville as they disposed of Basingstoke Town by five goals to one.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, there was plenty of drama in our Game of the Day as Black Country rivals, Stourbridge and Halesowen Town battled it out.

With the score I-I, a last minute goal from Ethan McLeod looked to have won it for the hosts only for Kieren Donnelly to hit a stoppage time leveller to keep his side in second place.

There were hat-tricks for Will Glennon of St. Ives Town and Stamford AFC's Jack Duffy.



In the Pitching In Southern League Division One South, Yate Town reached the 40-point mark but they had to settle for a share of the spoils at Melksham Town in a I-I draw.

There was drama at Bristol Manor Farm as they played host to second-place Exmouth Town. A delayed start due to a missing match official meant that the visitors' boss, Kevin Hill, took the flag as assistant referee. His side were to lose to a last minute goal from Jacob Spence. Four players saw red as Bemerton Heath Harlequins turned a one-goal deficit late on into 2-1 victory over Thatcham Town, whilst both Malvern Town and

Mousehole hit five goals in commanding home wins over Cribbs and Didcot Town respectively.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, our Game of the Day saw Flackwell Heath inflict only Hadley's second defeat of the season with an excellent 3-0 away success.

Berkhamsted remain top following a routine 2-0 triumph over Biggleswade FC as Real Bedford remain hot on their heels following a 3-1 away win at Northwood.

MACK SHINES

We head to the New Forest where a teenage goalkeeper from a famous footballing family is making a name for himself in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South. Ashley Hammond reports...

Talented teenage goalkeeper, Mack Allan, was offered a one-year professional contract with FA Premier League outfit, AFC Bournemouth, last week, and is crediting this season's ongoing loan spell with Bashley in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South for securing him the opportunity.

The 18 year-old shot-stopper has been in good for for the New Forest side so far this season, as he balances life as a third-year scholar with AFC Bournemouth U21s with his first extended run in men's senior football on loan at Bashley.

"I think Bash have helped me get that," he said of his Cherries offer. "The other day I played for AFC Bournemouth and felt more mature after having played for Bashley.

"I felt more calm and more relaxed because I've been playing all these games and I've learnt so much, I just felt like I could go in and show them what I've been doing.

"I'm noticing the difference straight away, as soon as I started playing, some of the saves I was making. I wouldn't have made those before Bashley, and some of the positions I was getting myself in, I felt like I've improved so much already just for being here [at Bashley] this short amount of time." Playing for Bashley in the men's game, he said, felt more cut-throat than age group football with The Cherries.

"It's like you need to win at Bashley to help players earn their wages," he added. "Whereas at AFC Bournemouth it's more about progression and how we play. I kind of like the pressure, you have to win because otherwise you are letting people down."

Of his time at the club so far, he said; "I think I've done well, I've started every game bar a few cup games and made a couple of clean sheets. "The feedback from the manager and the lads is that I've done well and shown what I'm about both on and off the pitch.

"Some people would come in on loan and be shy and not show themselves but I feel like I've come in and got stuck in straight away to the non-League environment."

His highlight so far he said was his last minute save off the line against Bideford AFC a couple of weeks ago to rescue a 3-2 home win.

"I was buzzing after that, that's why I'm here to have moments like that," he added. "It's really early days and sometimes I realise I'm only 18 and I've got a lot of learning to do. Sometimes I make a mistake and let a goal in and beat myself up over it but sometimes it's good to make mistakes and learn from them and that's what Bashley is about, going on loan and not just making mistakes but learning from decisions."

BASHLEY | MACK ALLAN

Thankfully Allan has a big support network around him to look out for him and offer him advice, not least Cherries' first-team 'keeper, Kepa Arrizabalaga, formerly of Real Madrid, with whom he has been training with at AFC Bournemouth almost every day this month.

"It's such a good experience to train with him because he's such a big name and has two Champions League winning medals [at Chelsea and Real]," Allan continued. "I wasn't even speaking to him the first few days because I was a little nervous but watching him and learning from what he does is great experience and I take what he tells me or what I've seen him do into my games."

Then there is his uncle Jimmy Ball who manages AFC Totton in the Premier South. "I speak to him quite a lot because he's in non-League as well, and he gave me lots of advice regarding my pro contract. He told me what to expect from that meeting because he's usually the one on the other side of the table.

"He's quite hard on me and I like it that way, I don't want him to be soft and tell me I'm doing well when I'm not, I'd rather him tell me, which he does."

If you've worked out the Ball family name connection, then you would have realised that Mack is also the grandson of England's 1966 World Cup-winning midfielder Alan Ball, who managed Saints, Pompey and Man City, and also starred for Arsenal and Everton. He's also a cousin of the McAtee brothers, John who plays for Bolton and lames, who plays for Man City.





HELPING HAND | The legendary Neville Southall has given plenty of good advice to the young goalkeeper

"I did meet my grandad but I can't remember him [Alan died when Mack was aged one], but I feel like he's been with me my whole life because of how much people talk about him and how many people come up to me to tell me how much they loved him, or to tell me a story about him.

"I feel like he's been in my life the whole time, he's my greatest inspiration, so anything I do I look up to him.

"I wouldn't say I feel any pressure to carry on his name, but obviously I want to, and that's what I aspire to do."

Because of his grandad's Everton links being part of the Holy Trinity in midfield with Howard Kendall and Colin Harvey that won the 1970 league title, Mack is a massive Toffees fan and has legendary keeper Neville Southall on speed dial.

"Whenever I go to watch Everton I get random people coming up to me telling me different stories about grandad and it's crazy to think they know more about my grandad than I do," Allan admitted. "But it's good to hear anything and I would never not listen. I want to know everything."

Of Southall, he said; "I've got quite close to him and chew his ear off. I've watched all his highlight reels and speak to him quite a lot.

"I ask him about how he dealt with pressure moments and he just says go out, puff your chest out and smile."

NEWS ROUND-UP

SWINDON SUPERMARINE | FULLY FOCUSSED

Last Saturday's come-from-behind victory made it five games unbeaten for Swindon Supermarine as their climb up the Pitching In Southern League Premier South table.

The Wiltshire outfit now sit seventh, just a couple of points and places off the play-off zone.

"We started the season poorly," admitted skipper, Ryan Campbell, who broke through the 300-appearance mark for the club earlier this season. "We had quite a few new faces come in over the summer, so it took a little while for us to gel, but recently things have really started to click into place and we've hit some good form.

"I think we're fifth in the current form table, so it's a case of keeping this momentum going for as long as we can.

"We knew how tough this League would be; there are some really strong teams involved this year and it's nice to see us sitting seventh as opposed to this time last year when we were in the relegation zone.

"The League is the most competitive that it's been in a few years, so that makes our current position even more impressive. There are shock results week in, week out and you have to be on your game in every minute of every game or else you will get found out.

"There's still a lot of football to be played and we will keep ticking games off one-by-one. For me personally I will be looking to contribute to us winning football matches. Keeping clean sheets is just as important as scoring goals so I want to be able to play my part at both ends of the field. "If I can do that, then my job will be done." A mouth-watering trip to AFC Totton took place earlier today.

It hasn't taken Westbury United's Charlie Walton long to get back into the swing of things. His first start last weekend since returning from injury saw him make his mark within the opening 60 seconds.

Known as The Butcher, Walton carved open the Willand Rovers defence to put his side ahead with just a minute on the clock and then he served up a second before quarter-of-an-hour had even been played.

As the wind and rain continued to lash down, Westbury went in at the break three goals to the good before leaving the field at the end caked in mud but celebrating a commanding 4-0 away win, a result which pulled them away from the bottom four. "It was a magnificent team performance," Walton told us. "The conditions were absolutely ridiculous throughout the game, but the boys grabbed hold of the challenge with both hands and showed our hosts, and the rest of the League, that we are not here to be messed about with!

NEWS ROUND-UP

EMIRATES FA CUP SECOND ROUND PREVIEW

Sunday is going to be a big day for our two remaining representatives in the Emirates FA Cup.

It all starts at noon when Pitching In Southern League Premier Central leaders, Kettering Town step out at home to Doncaster Rovers of Sky Bet League Two.

Then history is made for Harborough Town, also of the Premier Central, as they face their first-ever tie at this second round of the competition as they head to Sky Bet League One outfit, Reading.

Both clubs did us proud in the previous round, with the Poppies winning at Northampton Town and the Bees stinging Tonbridge Angels with a convincing away win.

We caught up with two players who are set to have a key role to play in both games.

"This is a massive opportunity for us," Kettering Town goalkeeper,

Dan Jezeph, told us. "We're really looking forward to the challenge that stands before us and the prospect of joining the big boys in the third round.

"It will be great to have 3,000 fans at Latimer Park; there's going to be a fantastic atmosphere and hopefully it will help us get the job done.

"As a group we're in a great place. We're unbeaten in our last nine games in all competitions, which alone is a good record to have. Not only are we doing ourselves proud in the FA Cup, but we're also four points clear at the top of the table and we're excited about what we can achieve this season."

So, what is the secret to this success so far?

"There's no secret," he added. "We have so much belief within the group; we know that we have something good going on here. "In the previous round, we went to Northampton and played our own game. We didn't change anything, we didn't sit back at all, we just did what we would normally do.

"Playing on a decent pitch with the quality we have on the ball really helped us on that occasion and it showed in our performance to win away at a side four Leagues above us.

"This season has started really well for us. I was part of the group last season after Nuneaton withdrew from the League. When I first joined we were in the bottom three and the difference from then to now is night and day.

"That's credit to the Gaffer and his staff for the players that they have been able to bring in and the high standards that they have set.

"We're ticking along nicely in the League; I just hope that when the time comes that we exit the FA Cup, we don't have that 'hangover' and can maintain what we're doing in the League.

"Our aim for the season is pretty clear; promotion, by whatever means, be it by winning the title or going through the play-offs. Personally I want to keep the goals we concede as low as possible. It's credit to the back four that so far we've been solid and have conceded the fewest goals.

"If that continues then we have more than enough firepower up top to win games, so it's a healthy combination!"

Over at Harborough Town, the sense of anticipation is also building nicely.

They warmed up for Sunday's game with a commanding 4-1 victory over Banbury United last weekend, a result which sees them reach the 20-point mark from their opening 17 games at Step 3.

There has been a buzz around The Beehive this week, which has been enhanced by former Brazil international, Sandro, stepping up his training with a view to being involved in the engine room.

"It's just going to be a surreal experience," admitted local lad, Freddie Robinson. "To reach this stage of FA Cup and play at such a fantastic stadium as Reading's, alongside a former FA Premier League player and Brazil international, it's crazy!

"What an experience it's going to be, something we could only dream of and we'll be looking to take it all in, enjoy the occasion, but ultimately try to continue our progress in this competition.

"For a club who had only previously reached the second qualifying round, this is dreamland. People are talking about us, which is fantastic.

"We went into the previous round with a game plan and it worked perfectly; everything just clicked for us and it was an afternoon that we will never forget. Hopefully we'll be able to say the same on Sunday, although this time we will be up against opponents from a much higher level.

"This is what the FA Cup is all about, anything can happen. We'll have 3,500 supporters behind us and we go into the tie on the back of a brilliant team performance last weekend to beat Banbury United.

"I am so proud to be representing my town. They say that you have to play the game and not the occasion, so that's what we will be aiming to do. Our preparations have gone well; everyone is level-headed and ready to go, so bring it on!"
