WIMBORNE TOWN v AFC PORTCHESTER

Wimborne Town have become the kings of Dorset this season. Three local derbies and three wins have left them purring in fourth place in the Pitching In Southern League Premier South.

Their latest bragging rights came courtesy of a 2-0 away win at Dorchester Town last weekend in a game which saw Max Francisco Bustamante find the net with an absolute screamer to seal the victory.

"It was probably not my most lively afternoon in terms of performance," Bustamante admitted to us. "But I was very pleased with the goal; I hit it well and it was nice to see it fly into the net at an important time for us.

"The windy conditions did not help matters. It was a case of playing percentages and taking our moments when they came, which we were able to do to get another big three points.

"It's a case of so far, so good this season. There's a good team spirit here, with some really strong leaders in the senior lads and willing learners amongst the younger lads, which makes a good

mix. As always, it's a tough League; you'll hear a lot of people saying anyone can beat anyone and I think that is the way in this League. You can see the gap from relegation to play off zones is never huge so every game is massive and never easy.

"The main aim is for us to enjoy our football and play with smiles on our faces. We're certainly doing that at the moment given the start we've had and we look to go into every fixture being tough to beat and break down.

"We want to progress as far as we can in every competition we enter; winning football matches breeds confidence and is a good habit to get into.

"Hopefully I can stay fit and contribute as much as I can by playing as many minutes as possible.

"The club finished last season strongly and we're doing all we can to be able to build on that and keep moving in the right direction.

"Saturday offers us a chance to turn our attention away from

the battle for League points. This is a national competition so we want to do well and give a good account of ourselves.

"It will be a tough test against unfamiliar opponents, but we'll do our preparation in the build-up and look to overcome the hurdle that stands before us without too many problems."

Having been part of the academy set-ups at both Barnet and Stevenage as a youngster, Bustamante moved into the non-League game, initially with Kings Langley before joining Wimborne Town whilst studying engineering at Southampton University.

AFC Portchester claimed the Wessex League Premier Division title last term to take their place in the Isthmian League South Central Division for this season, where they currently sit just below halfway with five wins and six defeats from the 11 League games so far.

It should come as little surprise that Redditch United are thriving with such a young and vibrant group of players this season.

At the helm is Mike Fowler, a man steeped in youth development who combines his role as first-team manager with that of Academy Manager at the Premier Central club.

Monday's hard-earned 1-0 victory over fellow high-flyers, Alvechurch, saw them strengthen their position within the leading pack as they won for the third game in a row and they did it with a squad where the average age was just 20.8 years old. We asked Fowler about his philosophies as a coach.

"Everything starts with the brilliant basics," he said. "Do them well; work incredibly hard to be better and have a strong mentality. There are more specific things but they're top secret!

"The plans that the club have are exciting and part of the reason I agreed to take on the responsibility for bringing the vision to life.

"The mantra is to keep moving forward and Improving. The growth in the club over the past five years have been impressive and long may it continue.

"The Premier Central has been very challenging but enjoyable so far this season. We have faced some really tough opposition and had some fantastic games. No two games are the same and there seems to be a lot of drama, which makes for interesting viewing.

"With regards to the aims for the team, they are pretty standard;

"We would also like to have a decent run in the FA Trophy, so Saturday's game against Gainsborough Trinity is an important one for us. We also want to do well in the county cups. I want us to be the flagship for our fantastic club and develop the footprint to support the development of the club as

For their return to home action against Larkhall Athletic on Saturday, they are giving free admission to all accompanied youngsters under the age of 16.

"I think it's really important to have a connection as a club with the next generation of supporters," said Sam Morcom. "Hopefully Saturday's offer will tempt some new faces to come along and they will return again on future occasions to give us their support.

"It's vital for a club like Exmouth to have this; the more support we get, the better. They will also see local lads in the team, giving their all on the pitch, and this is another source of inspiration for them, knowing that this is a club which gives opportunities to local talent."

After falling to a heavy defeat at Falmouth Town, Morcom and his team-mates responded by going to Hartpury last weekend and bringing home all three points from a good 2-1 away win.

"It was a very tough game," Marcom added. "Hartpury are a really good team on the ball, very fit and as a university outfit, we knew they train and work on patterns of play a couple of times a week.

"We tried to soak up the pressure and take advantage of our ability at set-pieces, which we did. We then had to sit in and defend at times, which I felt we did very well.

"Personally, this was tough for me as I prefer going forward, but I knew the game was going to be like that from the first minute and I was happy to play my part in an important away win.

"It's been a really good start to the season. We have had a tough opening set of fixtures and bar the first two games and Falmouth last week, I've felt we have done well in every game.

"We've developed a real ability to get the job done whether it's ugly or pretty. I also feel we can adapt and play many ways, which is a great skill to have and will stand us in good season as we go on through the season.

"Personally, I feel I've had a good start; I didn't start the first couple so needed to bide my time and wait for my chance.

"Coming in from the Western League, I have definitely noticed a step up in standard. I feel that mistakes are punished a lot more



at this level, and I feel teams are tactically so much more aware in this League. Also, players are much fitter, stronger and just better in general, so it's been a challenge that I have needed to rise to.

"We're right in amongst the leading pack at the moment and we want to stay there. Momentum is important in football and we'll be looking to build on this as we go along and see where it takes us. These are exciting times and the more fans that we can get to be part of the journey with us, the better."

Popular front-man, Matt Wright, is also in upbeat mood as the experienced goal-getter sees his mojo return.

"It really was a fantastic win on Saturday against a good side," he told us. "The boys had to dig deep and win ugly.

"On a personal level, I'm over the moon with how I've started

the season. I'm back scoring goals and winning football matches, which is what it's all about.

"There are a lot of good things for us to build on. Of course, we know that there is still a long way to go, but we've set some good standards in what is a good League.

"Let's hope that any supporters tempted to come along by the ticket offer will be treated to an entertaining afternoon, with three points at the end of it."

Three wins and just one defeat from their last five outings have thrust Larkhall Athletic just inside the top ten and they head to Devon full of belief for what promises to be a really keenly-fought encounter.

Amongst the scorers in the last game was Noah Mosanya, who like his team-mates, has found some form this season and is now in double figures in the goalscoring stakes in all competitions.

"I'm pleased with the form that I've been in," he told us. "Getting on the scoresheet is always nice and it was good to be able to add to my tally in the last game.



"Hopefully I can maintain this form over a prolonged period of time and help keep the club amongst the front-runners.

"We've been setting ourselves various targets in batches of games and we got the nine points that we were looking for from the last three matches, so now we have to add to that over the course of the next run of games.

"It's been a good season so far where we've developed and grown a lot. I feel that I have made a lot of progress and I know that many of my team-mates feel the same.

"There has been a good environment cultivated here, one in which we are able to express ourselves whilst learning a lot along the way.

"A personal highlight for me was the FA Cup tie at Chelmsford City. Whilst the result didn't go our way, the whole experience surrounding the game and the 90 minutes itself was a real learning curve.

"The standard of Division One Central is good again this year. We've faced some tricky opponents so far and I am sure that there are plenty more to follow, including Saturday where we head to a Flackwell Heath side that reached the play-offs last

season and with their games in hand, could be right up there with us in the mix this time around.

"It will be a good gauge for us on Saturday to see where we're at. We want to be in and around the leading pack and pushing for promotion; there's no reason why this can't be the case; we're a young team packed with talent and ability.

"Finding consistency will be key, but for now we're doing some good things and long may it continue. I just want to play my part with goals and assists."

Mosanya began his football journey at Brentford before he moved on to Stevenage when the Bees closed down their youth set-up. Having not been offered a professional deal at Stevenage, he went into the non-League game, getting game time with Arlesey Town and Wormley Rovers before linking up with Hertford Town.

For Flackwell Heath, they are reeling from losing their last two games, both on the road, at Welwyn Garden City – who beat them 1-0 in their last outing last weekend – and Biddleswade FC who nicked it 3-2 with a late goal proving to be the difference.

THE REST OF THE ACTION



Unbeaten leaders, Leighton Town, face a stern challenge as they take on Welwyn Garden City, who arrived in sixth place in the table with 20 points from their 12 League games. Second-place Biggleswade FC face a tricky assignment of their own as they go to a Beaconsfield Town team who also have their sights set on breaking into the leading pack.

Hitting the road are Ware who go to Leverstock Green who find themselves in the middle of the table, whilst Hitching Town have home advantage for the visit of Northwood, who go into the game one place off the bottom of the table.

Currently sitting at the foot of the table are Rayners Lane, who had a good 1-0 victory over AFC Dunstable in their last outing. The winning goal on that occasion was scored by Bradley Walsh

and he, along with his team-mates, will be chasing another three points on Saturday as they head to Stotfold.

As for AFC Dunstable, they welcome Barton Rovers, who sit in eighth spot, whilst level on points with them, Biggleswade Town take on Thame United, whose form so far this season is best described as up and down.

Both Enfield and Marlow have had slow starts to the campaign as they meet on Saturday with just one point separating the two teams. Finally, two teams on nine points so far, Milton Keynes Irish and London Lions, meet with the hosts fresh from a standout 5-2 win at Hadley in a game which saw Mason Spence score a cracking volley, which he told us all about this week.
