



TAUNTON TOWN v BASINGSTOKE TOWN

This encounter pits two unbeaten sides up against each other.

Taunton Town have successive hard-earned victories to their name so far having won 3-2 at Havant & Waterlooville on the opening day before following it up with a 2-1 triumph over newly-promoted Yate Town on Wednesday evening.

They take on a Basingstoke Town outfit who were boosted by the eve-of-season capture of Charlie Austin, who made a goalscoring debut in the 2-0 opening day victory over Wimborne Town and then made a 20-minute appearance in Tuesday's 1-1 draw at Evesham United.

"We've been given a tough run of opening fixtures, but they're all tough in this League," said Taunton Town manager, Richard Luffman. "We looked a bit leggy on Tuesday but that's a result of how hard we've worked over the past week; the main thing is we've got six points to our name from what has been a positive start in a difficult League.

"It's becoming stronger and more resourced every season. I feel sorry for the clubs in the south-east because some of the money being spent must make recruitment for them even more challenging.

"We've been able to add some top players for this level over the summer; we've added pace and power to an already-talented group. We've implemented a new style in our pre-season games, which we've taken into our League games and we're proud of the unbeaten run that we're currently on across these games.

"Things are going well but there's still a long way to go and anything can happen. I think Farnham Town, Bracknell Town and Gloucester City will expect top five. Tom has got a good side together at Dorchester Town and they have stated they are confident of winning it, despite their slow start, so I think these

For the second home game in quick succession, Chertsey Town welcome newly-promoted opposition as they take on Farnham Town whose introduction to life at this level has seen them beat Hungerford Town 1-0 on the opening day of the campaign before sharing the spoils in a dramatic 3-3 draw at Gosport Borough on Wednesday evening.

It's been a stuttering start for Dorchester Town, who lost at home to Tiverton Town in midweek, and they face a Walton & Hersham side who slipped to defeat at Hanwell Town in their last outing. ALVECHURCH v AFC SUDBURY

Two sides who will be looking to bounce back from disappointing defeats on Tuesday evening are Alvechurch and AFC Sudbury.

For Alvechurch, they went down to a 2-1 home derby day reverse at the hands of Bromsgrove Sporting, whilst AFC Sudbury had a night to forget at Bishop's Stortford as they succumbed by six goals to one.

But, as they say, it's a marathon not a sprint and long-standing Alvechurch chairman, Richard Thorndike, still has the passion burning bright and is still chasing dreams despite entering his 16th season in the role.

"I'm immensely proud of how far we have come," he told us. "I think it's fair to say we've established ourselves as a regular Step 3 club now despite being little more than a village team with a small fan base.

"Personally, I'm still chasing the dream of moving the ground to our 20-acre site at The Hayes and I'm in constant dialogue with the council regarding this.

"It's been dragging on for years now, but I'm confident we'll have a decision this year and then my short-term vision is to move the club to a new stadium next season when I'd like to think that we'll be at the very least a Step 3 club.

"Longer term, we want to get into The National League. It's a realistic and achievable target, but in order to get there it will take a tremendous amount of hard work by everyone involved here.





"I'm really looking forward to another season in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central. In truth, I dislike the off-season for a number of reasons like dealing with the turnover of players and all of the off-field stuff.

"This year it's been slightly different for us in that we have retained the core of our squad and added to it rather than having to start all over again with a completely new squad, as has been the case in the past.

"The make-up of our League is really interesting. You've got the big-spenders such as Harborough Town and Spalding United as well as the likes of Real Bedford and Worcester who have come up and will add an extra dynamic to things.

"Then there's the regulars who will all make it really competitive division this season.

"Like most seasons, we go into it looking to have a decent run in the FA competitions whilst also challenging for the play-off places."

Meanwhile, AFC Sudbury, have already drawn a line under their trip to Bishop's Stortford, which started badly before a ball was even kicked when goalkeeper, Marcus Garnham, suffered an injury in the warm-up and had to be replaced between the posts by front-man, Kyran Clements.

"It was a difficult evening," said Head Coach, Danny Laws. "We were up against it from the start, but we took a gamble, got back into it at 2-1 and gave it a real go in the opening 20 minutes or so of the second half.

"But when it's not your day rolling the dice, things like this can happen and it certainly wasn't our day on this occasion.

"We'll learn from it; I can't fault the effort of the players, they kept going until the end. We came up against a good side who did what they had to do and were ruthless.

"It's gone now and we have to ensure that we respond in the right way at Alvechurch on Saturday, that's all we can do. We've not made any excuses; circumstances didn't help our situation, but we have to be better than that."

With a win and a draw from their opening two games, Banbury United will be looking to add to their points tally as they host a Leiston outfit who are hunting their first victory after a draw and a loss from their first two games.

Hot on the heels of a 6-1 win on Tuesday, Bishop's Stortford play host to a Stamford AFC side who are yet to taste victory or even score a goal in their opening two outings following a goalless draw at Alvechurch on the opening day and 1-0 reverse at St. Ives on Monday.

Another side eager to get that first triumph under their belt are Spalding United who go to Bromsgrove Sporting, whilst Bury Town are buoyant having beaten Royston Town 1-0 on Tuesday and now host Harborough Town.

There's an interesting battle in prospect at Halesowen Town

SHAFTESBURY v THATCHAM TOWN



Shaftesbury have come out of the blocks full of purpose this season. A 5-1 away win at new-boys, Brixham AFC, on the opening day was followed by a 4-0 victory over Bideford AFC on Tuesday evening.

It leaves them sitting pretty at the top of the embryonic Pitching In Southern League Division One South table and looking forward to Saturday's Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round encounter with Thatcham Town.


Amongst the early goals has been summer signing, Jack Lovell. He knows a thing or two about cracking the code in this League having been part of the Wimborne Town team that claimed the title in 2023/24 and now he's looking to create similar memories during the campaign ahead.

"I don't think that I could have asked for a better start to my time here, both personally and for the team," he told us. "Two wins out of two in the League, where we've scored nine goals and conceded just one, and progress in the FA Cup.

"It was nice to get that long trip to Brixham out of the way early and to win so comfortably was a massive positive.

"To have a couple of goals to my name and four assists already is very pleasing. I'm playing with confidence again and with a smile on my face, which is so important.

"I think the reason we've started so well is that we're such a close-



knit group that get on extremely well both on and off-the-pitch. The togetherness and team spirit that exists here was evident to me quite quickly after signing.

"A lot of us have played together previously so we know each other well and how we play. That has certainly helped the new lads like myself hit the ground running.

"This is a hard League with some tricky opponents, plenty of travelling and difficult pitches. Everyone is capable of beating each other, but the key thing is for us to focus on ourselves and what we do; we have to work together and not get on each other's backs when things aren't going as well as we would like them to.

"We want to be able to play without pressure or fear. My target is to get 15-20 goals, I would be happy with that and hopefully that will help the team be amongst the play-off challengers. There's no reason why that can't be the case; we've already shown what we are capable of.

"That said, it's a long, hard season and consistency is so important. By sticking together, anything is possible and we're ready to face the challenges that come our way, particularly having started so well, you're there to be shot at.

"Attention turns to the FA Cup on Saturday and it would be nice to have a run in this competition. It can bring a lot of attention, positivity – and finance – to the club. Anything is possible. We have a home draw and we'll be looking to make that count at the weekend.

Lovell has reunited with Danny Holmes at Shaftesbury this season. The pair have previously worked together.

"Getting Jack here shows the backing and where we want to be as a club," added Holmes. "He is a top player that will cause defenders sleepless nights and I back him to score plenty at this level.

"He is a different type of player to what we have and really puts himself about, but with plenty of quality.

"To be able to bring him in from the level above is fantastic. He's a winner with a wealth of experience who has a big role to play in the journey that we want to take this club on."

Saturday's opponents, Thatcham Town, were in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South with Shaftesbury last season, but having finished two places off the bottom, they were relegated into the Combined Counties League Premier Division South where they have started with a draw and a defeat from their opening two League games.

They beat Petersfield Town 2-0 in the Extra Preliminary Round to reach this stage of the competition, whilst it needed a replay for Shaftesbury to overcome the challenge of Baffins Milton Rovers.



THE REST OF THE EMIRATES FA CUP ACTION FOR PITCHING IN SOUTHERN LEAGUE DIVISION ONE SOUTH CLUBS

After losing for the first time this season at SC Inkberrow during the week, Swindon Supermarine will be hoping that there is no hangover as they go to Alton. Another of our teams on the road is Tavistock AFC who head to Barnstaple Town, who have started brightly in the Western League Premier Division.

There's an all-Division One South clash as Brixham AFC and Mousehole do battle for the second game in a row, with the Cornish outfit holding the upper hand. Exmouth Town have home advantage against Buckland Athletic, whilst Falmouth Town against Bideford AFC is another tie that brings together two of our teams.

After their seven-goal haul away on Tuesday evening, Bishops Cleeve will be eying more goals as they travel to Hallen AFC, there's a local derby at Malvern Town as the in-form hosts lock horns with in-form Hellenic League Premier Division neighbours, Worcester Raiders.

A superb start to the season for Portishead Town sees them go into their home clash with Slimbridge in upbeat mood, whilst on the flip-side, Didcot Town go to Reading City looking to kick-start their sluggish start to the campaign.

ENFIELD v BIGGLESWADE TOWN



There's an all-Division One Central tie taking place on Sunday as Enfield play host to Biggleswade Town, just a week after the two sides went head-to-head in League action.

For the visitors it has been a positive start to life back at this level following relegation at the end of last term as they followed up their 2-1 home victory over Enfield with a hard-earned 1-0 triumph at the much-fancied Hitchin Town on Tuesday evening, a result which sent out a clear message of their intentions.

"I think that Tuesday's game is best described as a smash-andgrab," smiled Seb Simpson. "We'll definitely take the three points, not many teams will go to Hitchin this season and win.

"We've won our opening two games without performing anywhere near where we know we can. The performances will come; at this early stage of the season it's all about winning and gaining momentum and we're doing just that.

"There have been signs of promise already considering that we are basically a whole new team. We'll take this early positivity and look to carry on the momentum, continuing on Sunday as we face Enfield for the second time already this season.

"Personally I feel that I have done okay. There's always room for improvement and it will come with game time.

"It's a very competitive division that we face this season and every week will bring a different type of test. Consistency and mentality are key and if we have these each week, we have a great chance

For Enfield, they saw their game at Hertford Town abandoned on Wednesday evening due to a serious injury to a home player, so the opening day defeat at the hands of Biggleswade Town is their only League action to date, though they have already played twice in the Emirates FA Cup, requiring a replay to overcome Wormley Rovers in the Extra Preliminary Round.

"We have a good group here," said summer signing, Nathan Brathwaite. "There's lots of quality within the team, and also a good group of people off the pitch too, which will stand us in good stead.

"The FA Cup is a competition where anything can happen, it's all about who's better on the day and wants it more. A run in it for a club like ours can make a big difference.

"I made my first appearance in the FA Cup last season and it was actually against Enfield FC, believe it or not. It was a very special moment for me; I've always enjoyed watching the FA Cup, with Plymouth Argyle's victory over Liverpool last season being a moment I enjoyed as it shows the beauty of this competition in that anything can happen.

"This is an important time for me as I will be competing in this League for the first time too and I am sure it will be just as competitive as everyone is telling me!
