Friday's latest storm failed to have any real impact on our fixtures across all four divisions, with only one game postponed.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier South, leaders, Merthyr Town, left it late to beat Taunton Town. They did it with ten men following the dismissal of Jack Evans early in the second half as Ricardo Rees hit a stoppage time brace.

Just behind them, AFC Totton were convincing 4-0 victors over Plymouth Parkway, whilst Gloucester City and Dorchester Town were both held to draws.

There were some good away displays with Marlow hitting five goals at Chertsey Town and both Hungerford Town and Hanwell Town notching four goals apiece at Bracknell Town and Basingstoke Town respectively.

Over in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, leaders at the start of the day, Halesowen Town, lost at Stratford Town, whilst AFC Telford United went down 3-1 at Alvechurch and Kettering lost at home to Bromsgrove Sporting.

It meant that Bedford Town went top with their 2-2 home draw with Banbury United.

Pitching In Southern League Division One South leaders, Yate Town, were handed a heavy home defeat by an impressive Malvern Town, who went home 3-0 winners. It meant that Exmouth Town were able to close the gap to five points after they won I-0 at Mousehole in our Game of the Day.

Helston Athletic made a return to winning ways with two stoppage time goals to overturn a one-goal deficit at the hands of Cribbs, whilst Bemerton Heath Harlequins recovered from going a goal down early on to record a good 4-1 away triumph at Larkhall Athletic.

Meanwhile Falmouth Town's impressive form continued as they too came from behind to win at Bideford with a late goal.

In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, Real Bedford remain top after they won 3-1 at Welwyn Garden City. They were able to increase their lead over Berkhamsted who had to rely on a stoppage time leveller to rescue a point at home to an in-form Leighton Town. Flackwell Heath also left it late to beat Kings Langley.

Merthyr Town 2 Taunton Town 0



The popular defender was forced to don the goalkeeping gloves for the second time this season last weekend and put in an assured display to help his side, Dorchester Town, chalk up a 1-0 victory over Bracknell Town, including a superb finger-tip save right at the death.

Spetch took his place between the posts in the 35th minute after injury forced regular stopper, Gerard Benfield, out of the action.

"Once it was clear that Gerard could not continue, I had no hesitation in taking over," Spetch told us. "I did it on the opening day of the season and kept a clean sheet on that occasion for ten minutes plus stoppage time against Havant & Waterlooville.

"This time I had longer in goal and the added time at the end seemed to take forever, but it's another clean sheet and, more importantly, three big points for us. I am just waiting for my clean sheet bonus now!

"If I'm being totally honest, I didn't have an awful lot to do and that's credit to the boys in front of me who defended as though their lives depended on it.

"To a man, everyone battled so well to get us the win and with the teams just below us all dropping points, it made it even more special and gives us a bit of breathing space from the chasing pack within the top five.

"I feel that the more this season has gone on, the better we have become. It was a bit of a slow start with too many draws, but we've started to turn those draws into wins to put ourselves into a strong position going into the New Year.

"We're on a 14-game unbeaten run now, which in this League is a great achievement in itself and long may it continue!

"Going into the season, our aim was to make the play-offs and we're on course to achieve that. There's still plenty of football to be played though and I feel that we need to be fighting for third place, anything beyond that would be a tall ask.

"The club is in a great position on and off the pitch to make that push for promotion back into The National League South. The club is full of proper people, from Shaun Hearn and Scott Symes, all the way to the people running the tea hut, everyone is in this together.

"I've been lucky enough to play in front of some big crowds

and at some great grounds in my career, but the Dorchester Town fan base is the best by a country mile and they have a big role to play in these weeks and months that lie ahead."

FROME TOWN | THE JOY OF REX

It's been a good week for Frome Town and their on-loan midfielder, Rex Mannings.

Having secured a 3-1 victory at Winchester City last weekend, they followed it up with a hard-earned but fully deserved 1-1 away draw at high-flying AFC Totton on Tuesday evening to make it just one defeat from their last six Pitching In Southern League Premier South games.

Mannings, who returned to the club earlier this season on loan from Vanarama National League South outfit, Chippenham Town, has weighed in with a goal in each game alongside two hardworking displays.

"I thought the lads were excellent as a collective on Tuesday," he told us. "Going into the game as underdogs and putting in a performance like that was fantastic. I thought we might have gone on to score more, but after conceding straight after going I-0 up, we had to sit back and focus on not conceding again.

"I believe the players' character and confidence is really shining through at the moment, and we're seeing the best version of some very talented players here at the club.

"I'm always happy to score—it's such a great feeling and another step towards maintaining these strong performances.

"As a newly-promoted side, it was always going to be difficult stepping up a level this season; it's never going to be a walk in the park. There is not much difference between this level and the level above in The National League South, to be honest.

"It's such a competitive League and we're pushing as much as we can to get Frome into a better position.

"The goal for the rest of the season is to maintain this level of performance as a team and hopefully secure our place at this level for next season and then build from there.

"On a personal level, I just want to enjoy it, find my form, and do my best to help Frome Town for the remainder of the season."

A home encounter with Gloucester City was on the agenda for Manning and his team-mates today.





WELWYN GARDEN CITY | SPECIAL RECOGNITION FOR CLUB STALWART

There will be special recognition for Terry Hazell this afternoon to mark 60 years of sterling service to Welwyn Garden City FC.

The Pitching In Southern League Division One Central club play host to leaders, Real Bedford, and Terry will be on duty as usual.

He first watched the club in the mid-1960s when his brother-in-law, Vince Evans, was part of the Citizens' line-up.

It wasn't long before he was asked to join the club's committee but because of his work as a lorry driver, his main role was collecting and delivering club equipment. He remained on the committee as the club moved to its present ground at Herns Way in 1969 and in the years that followed, through his footballing sons, David and Andy, his involvement increased.

In the mid-1980s he managed the youth team for two seasons and then became Vice-Chairman of the club before assuming the Chairman role and serving for ten years – making him the longest-serving chairman the club has had post-war.

"We had varying degrees of success during those years," recalls Terry. "We did consistently well under the management of Malcolm Doctor and Billy Bannister, who took us to the third qualifying round of the FA Cup.

"Bannister's appointment was part of a link-up with Stevenage FC, then known as Stevenage Borough, as we acted briefly as a nursery club for them during their non-League days."

A club trustee for the past 30 years, he stepped down in the mid-2000s and moved to live near Lymington in Hampshire, but still travelled up regularly to watch home and away games.

In 2013 he moved to live closer to the club again and has been a regular ever since, with he and wife, Sandra, responsible for pre and post-match hospitality and entertaining opposition guests.

"The club has come a long way since I first started watching them as a Herts County League side in 1965," he added. "To become an established Southern League club is a massive achievement and the reward for so much hard work and dedication by a lot of people, many of whom are no longer with us, who have played major role in what we have achieved.

"I just hope I've helped make a small contribution in that too."
