The story of the day came in the Pitching In Southern League Premier South where Michael Folivi scored all four goals as Sholing secured a 4-I away win at Bracknell

It was a result which moves them away from the lower reaches of the table.

The day's other game in the Premier South saw Dorchester Town come back from 2-I down with ten men to beat Hungerford Town 4-2 and in doing so move into the top five.

A quickfire brace from Olaf Konzsela helped them secure victory here and leave their opponents in the bottom four.

Just one game took place in the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central as Spalding United recovered from going a goal down early on to beat Barwell 2-1, a result which moves them out of the bottom four and puts them level on points with today's opponents. Only one game took place in the Pitching In Southern League Division One South as Bashley and Malvern Town drew I-I.

The visitors edged ahead from the penalty spot as Jack Watts converted, but the hosts levelled with a spot-kick of their own early in the second period as Lewis Ross fired home.

A red card for skipper, Luke Payne, left the away team with a man less for the final 20 minutes, but they were able to hold on to their point.

Two games took place in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central as two second half strikes saw Beaconsfield Town win 2-0 at Enfield to move away from the lower reaches of the table.

It was level at Biggleswade FC as their opening goal on 66 minutes was cancelled out by a late leveller from Ware. Congratulations to Gosport Borough who progressed on penalties in the Isuzu FA Trophy as Alvechurch and Hadley both did themselves proud against higher-level hosts. Reports inside.

#### PITCHING IN SOUTHERN LEAGUE

### Bracknell Town I Sholing 4 (Premier South)

Folivi notched his second, this time from the penalty spot, just before the half-hour mark to restore the away team's lead and then went on to complete his hat-trick as he finished off a neat move just past the hour-mark.

A fourth goal was just around the corner for Folivi as he simply blew the home side away on what was a good afternoon's work for the away team.

## Dorchester Town 4 Hungerford Town 2 (Premier South)

It was first blood for the home side as Luke Pardoe opened the scoring just before the half-hour mark, but it wasn't long before the visitors got back in it when Oliver Haste was dismissed and Louis McGrory despatched from the penalty that followed.

Buoyed by the goal, the visitors then went ahead soon afterwards with a goal from Alefe Santos D'Abadia.

Going into the penalty shoot-out full of belief, our boys secured a 3-2 victory to progress into the fourth round.





#### **NEWS ROUND-UP**

#### STOURBRIDGE | HIGH INTENSITY

There was plenty of drama at last weekend's local derby between Stourbridge and Halesowen Town as the two Pitching In Southern League Premier Central heavyweights went head-to-head at the War Memorial Ground.

Whilst ground issues meant that the capacity had to be limited, there was still a crowd of just under 2,000 in attendance to watch a game that ebbed and flowed throughout.

The visitors, who sit second in the table, took the initiative with the opening goal but the home side hit back and two goals within the final ten minutes looked like giving them the bragging rights as they turned the scoreline around.

That was until the fourth minute of stoppage time when the scores were levelled and both sides had to settle for a share of the spoils.

For a number of players on the Stourbridge team, it was their first taste of what is known locally as the 'Number 9' derby, a reference to the bus route that links the two Black Country towns. "Local derbies always bring that extra level of intensity, but last weekend's game was certainly intense," Dom Lewis, one of a whole host of summer signings, told us. "The atmosphere was fantastic and the game went one way and then the other.

"It was everything you want and expect from a local derby between two teams who have started the season well. It's just a pity that having got ourselves in front late on, we couldn't hold on to it.

"These are exactly the type of games that you want to be involved in as a player and I enjoyed it out there.

"It's been a positive start so far for myself and the team. I wasn't playing as much as I would have liked at the start of the season, but I have managed to establish myself as the games have gone on and I feel that I'm getting into a good rhythm now at this level.

"Each game I feel that I am learning more and contributing to the team. As we enter the month of December, we're sitting in a good position. "It's very challenging and a definite step up from what I have previously been used to, but I went into the season with my eyes wide open and expected it to be just as demanding and competitive as it has proven to be so far. "For me it's a case of consistently improving my skills to ensure that I keep contributing to the team. My aim is to be a reliable and regular performer who gets his job done for the team. "We are a focussed group of players; we know what we want to achieve and we'll continue doing all we can on and off the pitch to be able to get to where we want to be. We're also fortunate to have such a fantastic fan base to help drive us on."

#### EXMOUTH TOWN | STRAIGHT DOWN THE LINE

Exmouth Town manager, Kevin Hill, has been involved in the game for three decades and in that time he has seen a lot. But even he didn't expect to be running the line in his 250th League game in charge of the Devon club last weekend. The situation arose in their Pitching In Southern League



Division One South clash at Bristol Manor Farm when, with one match official short, the home club put out an appeal to find a replacement as the clock ticked down towards kick-off time.

"Various avenues were explored to find someone qualified to step in, quite literally, at the last minute," Hill told us. "With the prospect of the game being postponed if no-one could be found, I said that if the worst came to the worst, I would do it as long as everyone was in agreement.

"I know their Gaffer well and he was happy as were the other two match officials. I had my co-manager, Dave Pearse, alongside me so I knew that the team would be in safe hands with him looking after them, so I took the flag and got kitted out.

"I made it clear that I would keep it simple; just flag for throw-ins, corners and offsides, I wouldn't get involved in any other stuff. By the same token, it was made clear that I wouldn't be able to do any coaching from my position, so that was all left to the guys in the dug-out.

"I have to admit that it was strange seeing my team right in front of me yet not being able to shout instructions to them!

"There was an offside I gave against my player after ten minutes, but it was the right decision and he accepted it. To be honest, there were no problems at all throughout the game, it was played in the right spirit and the players appreciated the situation. "It was certainly a new situation for me and I actually quite enjoyed it! Like most managers, I have criticised assistant referees over the years and had banter with them during games, so it was good to be able step up and actually give it a go to be able to see things from their perspective and put myself in their shoes as it were.

"There are so many tasks to do on matchdays and so much to think about, it was nice to step out of the stress of the dug-out for a little while!

"It wasn't how I expected my 250th game in charge to go and we also had the disappointment of losing to a last-minute goal, but I had some positive comments from both sides about my performance, so that was nice.

"There was even one point when I out-paced the winger and full-back as they chased a ball down the wing, so there could be no complaints about me not being able to keep up with play!

"Seriously, I am full of respect for the job that all match officials do and now I can say that I have given it a go too."

#### PST SPORT CLUB OF THE MONTH AWARDS | NOVEMBER 2024

### The PST Sport Club of the Month Awards for November2024 have been announced.

In the Pitching In Southern League Premier Central, the winners are Kettering

The month started in the most glorious way for the Poppies as they came from behind to beat Football League neighbours, Northampton Town, 2-1 after extratime in front of the live television cameras in the Emirates FA Cup.

With a spring in their step, they won their next game 3-1 against Redditch United thanks to a brace from Jonny Edwards and a further strike from Nile Ranger.

A good 3-1 away triumph at AFC Telford United was next on the agenda as Jonny Edwards once more grabbed two goals in between an effort from Tyree Wilson as they beat another opponent from within the leading pack.

They had to settle for a share of the spoils in a 2-2 home draw with Bedford Town. Isiah Noel-Williams cancelled out an opener from the visitors before Andi Thanoj

put them ahead with just under 15 minutes to go. There was a sting in the tail as the visitors levelled matters in the final minute.

The month ended with a last-gasp goal of their own giving them a hard-earned 2-1 victory over in-form Leiston. Jonny Edwards was on hand to give them an early lead, which was subsequently cancelled out with ten minutes left on the clock. However, Isiah Noel-Williams stepped up with an 89th minute winner.

The Pitching In Southern League Premier South accolade has gone to AFC Totton, who win for the second month in a row.

A Tony Lee brace gave them a winning start to the month as they came home from Marlow with a 2-0 success. They were also leading by the same scoreline when their next game, at Gosport Borough, was abandoned due to floodlight failure.

Having made progress in the Isuzu FA Trophy courtesy of a 2-0 win at Lewes, they brought the month to a close with a good 2-1 triumph over Swindon Supermarine with early goals from Charlie Austin and Tom Blair putting them in a commanding position against in-form opponents. In the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central, it is Berkhamsted who are celebrating.

They got the month underway with a 3-1 victory at AFC Dunstable as first half strikes from Tom Newman, who bagged a quickfire brace within the opening ten minutes, and Lewis Thorpe set them on their way to a good away day win.

It was the same scoreline in their next game as they returned to home soil with victory over Kings Langley. This time, though, they had to come from behind and scored all three goals in the second half with JJ Lacey setting them on their way from the penalty spot and an own goal putting them in front. Louie Collier rounded things off with the decisive third goal.

A late strike earned them a share of the spoils from a 2-2 draw at Enfield. Dan Newton cancelled out an early opener from their hosts before Adam Watkins grabbed a late equaliser after their opponents had regained the lead with 20 minutes to go.

Those battling qualities came to the fore once more in the next game as they overcame the stubborn challenge of Leverstock Green with Louie Collier grabbing the all-important goal midway through the second period.

A trip to fellow high-flyers, Flackwell Heath, produced an entertaining game which they won 4-2. JJ Lacey put them ahead only for the scoreline to be turned on its head before the half-hour mark. However, the pendulum swung back in their favour when an own goal put them back on level terms and soon afterwards, Louie Collier regained their lead. A late strike from skipper, Matt Bateman, sealed a big three points.

The month ended with Bateman on the scoresheet again to open the scoring against Biggleswade FC. Dan Newton completed a deserved 2-0 win after the break to maintain their position at the top of the table.

Taking the Pitching In Southern League Division One South honour is Evesham United.

They got the month off to an impressive start by going to fellow high-flyers, Melksham Town, and recording a hard-earned 1-0 victory with losh Barlow getting the vital goal.

A 1-1 draw earned them a point from their trip to Larkhall Athletic, with Toby Raison on the mark. It was followed by a 3-2 triumph over Helston Athletic as they got back into home action. Defender, Toby Raison, scored for the second game in a row to put them ahead only for the visitors to hit back. Reegan Messenger put them back ahead early in the second half and after that too was cancelled out, Messenger delivered the winner with just over ten minutes to go.

After going down to a narrow 1-0 loss at leaders, Yate Town, they bounced back to end the month with a commanding 4-0 victory over Falmouth Town as Levi Steele helped himself to two of the goals with Amer Awadh and an own goal also on the scoresheet. We congratulate the four winners:
