

Saturday is International Women's Day and just like every other weekend throughout the season, across our four divisions there will be women playing key roles at our member clubs and enjoying the action as we get into the 'business end' of the season.

At Gloucester City AFC, one of the first faces that you see upon arrival at the KMM Energy Stadium is that of Lisa Mann.

A loyal and popular volunteer for around 15 years now, she is part of 'Team Turnstile' who always ensure a warm welcome for both sets of supporters.

Lisa's involvement as an integral member of the matchday staff is a far cry from the days when she used to bring her son along to games and wait in the car.

"My son, Charlie, is the stadium announcer," said Lisa, as she takes up the story. "When he was young, 13 or so, he wanted to start watching City, who were then playing in Cheltenham.

"I used to drive him to every game and sit in my car outside the ground waiting for him. Then a request went out after I'd been doing this for about 18 months for volunteers and that's how I got involved.

"I am now a proud member of Team Turnstile, but previously I was a Golden Goal ticket seller and have also stood outside on car park duties.

"I love being part of Team Turnstile. We get to speak to all our lovely regulars each week and also some of the not so lovely visitors that can attend, depending on how much they may have had to drink beforehand!

"It is a friendly place to volunteer because of the different people who all have our club in common. The kindness I was shown recently when I lost my Dad by so many fans is something that you cannot buy. It is like a mini family and people genuinely care for one another.

"Quite simply, volunteers keep clubs going as the time they give is immeasurable."

It was during a game that Lisa first met her partner, Dean.

"During my early days of actually going in to watch games, I remember some loud-mouthed man stood behind me," she added. "He was screaming at an injured opposition player. I asked my son who the foul-mouthed yob was and it turned out his name was Dean.

"I discovered over time that his bark is most definitely worse than his bite and we are still together today, sharing our love for City!"

Having secured an impressive 2-1 win at fellow high-flyers, Poole Town, last weekend, Gloucester City return to home action on Saturday determined to strengthen their place in second spot as they welcome Bracknell Town.

When the two sides met earlier in the season, Bracknell were amongst the

They go into the game in tenth place in the table, seven points

off the top five. Recent results have tailed off from what they were, but nevertheless it has been an impressive turnaround and they will be looking to respond to a 4-2 home loss at the hands of Chertsey Town in their last outing.

Things continue to head in the right direction for Farnham Town following a positive week so far

Front-runners, Walton & Hersham, were able to march on in their last outing as they beat Yate Town 3-1. This weekend they hit the road for Havant & Waterlooville, who sit tucked inside the top ten and still with a place in the play-off places in their sights.

Meanwhile, Poole Town will be looking to respond in the right way following their 2-1 home reverse at the hands of fellow high-flyers, Gloucester City, last weekend. A local derby at Dorchester Town awaits them on Saturday as their hosts have found some recent form, which has taken them out of the bottom four.

It's been a productive week for Farnham Town. Having battled out a 2-1 win at Weymouth last weekend, they went on to secure a 3-1 triumph over Yate Town on Tuesday. They have also seen ongoing ground improvement work take place as they prepare to welcome Hanwell Town. The visitors will be seeking the points to aid their climb away from relegation danger.

Three teams sit on 51 points, with Sholing currently holding

the final play-off spot. They go to one of the other teams on 51 points, Gosport Borough, in what is sure to be a hard-fought encounter. Meanwhile Chertsey Town will be looking to make home advantage count as they welcome Basingstoke Town.

Down at the bottom, Tiverton Town are well adrift at the foot of the table as they prepare to host Weymouth, who currently hold the final relegation place. Plymouth Parkway parted ways with their manager this week and they will be desperate for the points as they go to a Taunton Town outfit who are level on points with them. This is a big game for both Devon clubs.

Yate Town have been drawn into a relegation battle and they face a home encounter with mid-table Wimborne Town on Saturday, whilst after winning away at Plymouth Parkway last weekend, Hungerford Town will be aiming to build on it as they host Uxbridge.

Elsewhere, Berkhamsted will be looking to keep their play-off bid alive as they go to Evesham United.

HALESOWEN TOWN v STOURBRIDGE

The script couldn't have been written better for Saturday's Black Country derby.

Always an intense affair, both teams go into the game desperate for the points at opposite ends of the table.

For the home side, they are seeking a response to a 1-0 loss at Bishop's Stortford last weekend, a result which leaves them one place and one point out of the play-off places.

Meanwhile, Stourbridge were finally able to escape the clutches of the bottom four on Tuesday evening following their 2-1 away triumph at Alvechurch and they are looking to build upon their recent momentum to continue to climb the table.

"After what has been a busy schedule of games, it's been good to have a full week of preparation for Saturday," admitted Halesowen Town manager, Russ Penn, who celebrated his second anniversary at the Yeltz's helm last weekend. "These are always intense affairs, but even more so on this occasion with both sides desperate for the points.

"At this stage of the season it's all about getting the three points in the bag and that's why last weekend's defeat was so disappointing.

"The commitment and effort of the players cannot be faulted, but we lacked the necessary quality when we need it most. The conditions haven't helped, but we got into some unbelievable areas that we were not able to take advantage of.

"We just couldn't find the back of the net on that occasion; days like this happen and now our focus is on ensuring that we can get back onto it at the weekend.

"There will be a large and vocal crowd in attendance, that's for sure, and we are ready to get out there and do a job.

"We have our points target for the season in mind; it's in our hands and we have to take ownership of that. We have to make sure that we don't rest on our laurels. We've worked hard to get into this position and this hard work must continue.

"Winning is hard work and you have to put all of your efforts into it, from training to dissecting the opposition, to going out there and performing.

"We have come a long way this season and we want that progress to continue. Can we beat our points tally from last season and finish higher? That's the aim, but at the same time we know how competitive this League has been this season.

"From our point of view, we have the added advantage of a fantastic fan base, one of the best at this level, and the backing that we get is truly amazing. They stay with us from the first whistle to the last and that's contributed to us scoring some late goals this season.

"As I say, Saturday will have an electric atmosphere and we need everyone pulling in the same direction to get those big three points against neighbours who have seen a big upturn in form since we last met."

Not only have things improved on the pitch for Stourbridge, they have also recently received planning permission for ground improvement work at their War Memorial Athletic Ground home, whilst they are close to securing a new long-term lease.

Banbury United were jumping for joy on Tuesday – will they be doing the same this weekend?

There's a great battle developing at both ends of the table. At the top, Spalding United, are fresh from a commanding 3-0 victory over play-off hopefuls, Redditch United, last weekend. They have a tricky assignment on Saturday as they go to Needham Market, who go into the game just a point off the top five.

Title challengers, Harborough Town, suffered a set-back at Banbury United during the week as they went down 1-0. As such they will be determined to get straight back into winning ways at the weekend as they face a Worcester City who have had two away wins this week, winning at Royston Town and Bishop's Stortford, to leave them on the 50-point mark and with the play-offs in their sights.

Just below the top two, Real Bedford added to their points tally with a 2-2 home draw against Needham Market on Tuesday. They head to fourth-placed Quorn, who are looking to shrink the six-point gap that currently exists between the two teams. Quorn also shared the spoils in their midweek game as they drew 4-4 at Bury Town.


Making up the top five is Redditch United who will be hoping to make home advantage count as they host a St. Ives Town side who are desperate to halt a slide that is taking them towards the relegation zone.

Talking of the bottom four, Royston Town's chances of avoiding the drop are becoming slimmer by the week and on Saturday they hit

the road to Barwell, who moved into the relegation places following Stourbridge's victory on Tuesday evening. The other two members of the bottom four also face each other as AFC Sudbury host Stamford AFC.

Elsewhere, Banbury United will be eager to build on Tuesday's excellent victory as they host a relegation-threatened Alvechurch whose confidence needs a boost. Just three points and two places separate Bury Town and Bishop's Stortford who go head-to-head in a battle to strengthen their place in mid-table, whilst Bromsgrove Sporting also have mid-table aspirations as they go to Kettering Town.

Leiston know that they can't afford to drop too many points as they aim to stay in play-off contention. They host a Stratford Town outfit whose season can best be described as a roller-coaster, which started with them battling amongst the bottom four before then challenging for the top five and now settling into the middle of the table.

He's the local lad done good. Bideford AFC skipper, Alex Byrne, chalked up his 200th appearance for his hometown club last weekend and he is determined to lead the club away from any lingering threat of relegation, starting on Saturday when they host a Bristol Manor Farm outfit who are having exactly the same thoughts.

"I'm very happy and proud to have reached this milestone for the club," Byrne told us. "I feel like I'm almost part of the furniture now and have really bought in to what the club is all about.



One place above them, Brixham AFC have suffered successive home defeats this week ahead of their trip to fourth-bottom, Melksham Town, who saw manager, Stuart Fleetwood, depart in midweek. This is a big game for both clubs.

Elsewhere, Mousehole AFC will be looking for an upturn in their home fortunes as they host Swindon Supermarine, who have started to find a bit of form themselves, whilst Sporting Club Inkberrow welcome Exmouth Town and finally, Willand Rovers' recent results have taken them out of the bottom four ahead of their home game against Didcot Town, who sit mid-table.

**ENFIELD FC
v HITCHIN TOWN (PLAYING FRIDAY)**

A first-ever senior hat-trick came about in a rather unconventional way for Joni Vukaj last weekend.

The Enfield FC front-man converted three penalties in Saturday's impressive 4-0 victory over play-off hopefuls, Thame United.
