

HUNGERFORD TOWN v SHOLING

Sholing did their hopes of securing a top five finish the power of good last weekend as they beat fellow play-off hopefuls, Chertsey Town, 4-0 to leapfrog their opponents.

"For me, this is the best part of the season. Every game becomes more important than the last and we have to keep standards high and give everything we've got for those precious three points that are on offer.

"This is an exciting League where anyone can beat anyone on their day. There are some really top players and top teams involved, so

it's just a fantastic challenge and a very high standard of football. "I want to keep contributing with goals. That was only the second hat-trick of my career last weekend, the first for Sholing, so it has whetted my appetite for more! "This is a special football club and we'll give it everything we've got between now and the end of the season and see where it takes us."

A trip to Hungerford Town – who are battling for the points for different reasons – awaits on Saturday.

Their hosts find themselves just inside the bottom four following a 4-0 loss at Weymouth last weekend – their second 4-0 reverse in a row having succumbed to Uxbridge by the same scoreline in their previous outing.

With things so tight in the lower reaches of the table, they know only too well the importance of winning their home games.

There's no stopping Walton & Hersham as they followed up last weekend's single-goal victory over Farnham Town with a convincing 4-1 away win at Wimborne Town on Tuesday evening. It means that they are 15 points clear as they go into Saturday's game at bottom club, Tiverton Town.

Moving into second place following their late victory over Dorchester Town on Tuesday evening are Farnham Town. They are making a habit of scoring late, late goals and host a Basingstoke Town outfit who are still in need of points to pull them away from any danger of the relegation zone.

Gloucester City will be eager to make home advantage count when they take on mid-table Uxbridge, particularly after they slipped to a disappointing 1-0 loss at Berkhamsted last time out. A couple of points behind Gloucester are Poole Town who came from behind to be struggling Taunton Town last time out. On Saturday they go to one of the teams on the fringes of the play-off places, Gosport Borough, in what is sure to be a hard-fought affair.

With Sholing currently occupying the last play-off place on goal difference, Chertsey Town will be looking to get back on track as they face a Wimborne Town outfit who have been struggling to find consistent form. Also still in content for a play-off spot are Berkhamsted, who go to Havant & Waterlooville on Saturday.

Down at the bottom, Tiverton Town couldn't have asked for a tougher test than the visit of runaway leaders, Walton & Hersham, whilst just above them, Taunton Town host a Hanwell Town outfit who need the points to pull away from the bottom four.

There's a mouth-watering clash between Yate Town and Weymouth. The home side sit three places off the foot of the table and are only two points off Saturday's opponents who are just outside of the relegation zone. Dorchester Town will be ruing not getting anything out of their trip to Farnham Town as they host Bracknell Town, whilst just above them Evesham United and a resurgent Plymouth Parkway do battle with one place and one point separating the teams at kick-off.

ST. IVES TOWN v SPALDING UNITED

It's what this stage of the season is all about. Spalding United found themselves two goals and a man down on Saturday at the hands of Halesowen Town.

They managed to pull a goal back to give them a lifeline, but as the clock ticked down into the final ten minutes and with tired legs, it was beginning to look as though they had given themselves too much to do.

Then up stepped substitute, Jack Roberts, whose brace, which included a late penalty, turned the scoreline on its head to secure a 3-2 win which took them back to the top of the Premier Central table, albeit until Tuesday evening when Harborough Town won at Bromsgrove Sporting.

"It was one of those games and one of those days," said Roberts, with a wry smile. "Going into the game we knew that it was a

massive one for us. I started on the bench so I was unhappy about that, but the team made a slow start.

"We just couldn't find our spark and then as half-time approached, we went a goal down.

"I came on just before the hour-mark, we were a goal down at the time but then it went to 2-0 and I knew that we had to try to step things up. The next goal was always going to be crucial and thankfully we got it, but we still had plenty of work to do and it's credit to the lads that we were able to battle out the win late on with a man less."

This is Roberts' first season in men's football and he is enjoying the challenge and relishing the run-in as they battle it out for the title.

There have been goals galore for Kettering Town this week

After winning at Bromsgrove Sporting during the week, Harborough Town went back to the top of the table. They are on their travels again on Saturday as they head to Alvechurch, whose 2-0 victory over Stamford AFC on Tuesday gave them a massive boost in their bid to avoid being dragged into the bottom four.

Third-placed Real Bedford were held to a goalless home draw by Worcester City on Tuesday and they are back at home on Saturday where they take on Stamford AFC who are perched just one place above the bottom four. Quorn reached the 60-point mark last weekend with their 2-0 victory over Banbury United and they face a free-scoring Kettering Town who have hit ten goals this week alone having followed up their 4-1 away win at AFC Sudbury with a 6-0 triumph over the same opposition during the week.

A return to winning ways on Tuesday evening moved Halesowen Town back into the top five. They had a commanding 3-0 success

against Banbury United and now prepare to host mid-table Bury Town. Goal difference puts the Yeltz in the play-off zone above Needham Market who face a Redditch United outfit who are one place and one point behind them, so it's sure to be an intriguing contest.

An intriguing encounter is also in prospect in the lower reaches of the table where bottom club, Royston Town host Bromsgrove Sporting whose stuttering form has left them just two points clear of the bottom four. Managerless, AFC Sudbury, go to Barwell, who despite being only one place above them are ten points clear.

Elsewhere, there's a mid-table battle between Banbury United and Bishop's Stortford, whilst Worcester City will be looking to keep their play-off hopes alive when they go to Leiston. Finally, having tasted three successive local derby wins on the road, Stourbridge are back in home action as they lock horns with Stratford Town as both teams look to strengthen their place in the middle of the table.

WESTBURY UNITED v PORTISHEAD TOWN

It's been a good, if not rather exhausting, week for Portishead Town.

Having chalked up a convincing 7-0 victory over Falmouth Town on Saturday, the return fixture down in Cornwall came hot on the heels, on Tuesday evening.

The long journey and return home in the early hours of Wednesday morning was well worth it as they secured another three points courtesy of a hard-earned 1-0 win to strengthen their position in the top five.

Figuring in both games was Owen Humphries, who bagged a brace in the home win.

"The lads put in a proper shift in both games," he told us. "We went about things professionally and got the six points over the two games, which is all that matters.

"I was happy with my performances and, of course, my two goals in the 7-0 win, but I should have also had a couple more that day, to be honest.

"We then had to show character and determination to go down to their place on a Tuesday night and battle out a win and a clean sheet. Over the course of both games we had to show many different qualities to get the job done."

Humphries admits that he is enjoying life at the club having made the step up from Clevedon Town earlier this year.

"Life at the club is class," he added. "There are so many great people involved and everyone, from the management, fans and my team-mates have made me feel welcome.

"It's good to be back at this level. I've been out of it for a couple of years, but it's still extremely competitive and probably even more demanding now. The Gaffer and the experienced lads in the group have been a massive help in getting me to believe in my ability and that I can kick-on in this League.

"I'm really looking forward to the run-in to the end of the season; there is so much at stake, but these are the games that you want to be involved in.

"As a team, the play-offs is our goal and ideally to finish as high up as we can in order to get the home advantage.

"There are some tough fixtures to come between now and the end of the season We're taking things game-by-game, though, and we're ready to put in another positive performance at the weekend as we head out on our travels once more, this time a little closer to home at Westbury United."

We ended by asking Humphries about his personal aims and targets.

"My personal goals from now until the end of the season is to try and contribute as many goals and assists as possible to the team so that we can get as many points as possible.

"I'm sure that with the quality we have in the team, we will be in and around the play-off positions, which is a great achievement for the club in their first season at this level."

Saturday sees them face a Westbury United team that are in the middle of the table but reeling from successive home defeats this week at the hands of Sporting Club Inkberrow last weekend and Brixham AFC on Tuesday evening.

Their recent form has been inconsistent as they cling on to a place just inside the top ten.

They head to fellow play-off hopefuls, Shaftesbury, on Saturday where they face opponents who occupy the last play-off spot and were pushed all of the way by Bashley in their last game.

In between them, Winchester City responded in the perfect way to their home reverse at the hands of Larkhall Athletic last weekend as they went to Bideford AFC on Tuesday and ran out 6-1 winners. Saturday sees them head to Sporting Club Inkberrow.

At the bottom, Tavistock AFC slipped to a 3-1 loss at the hands of second-bottom Bashley on Tuesday evening to leave their situation looking increasingly perilous. They host Bishops Cleeve on Saturday, whilst Bashley host a Bideford AFC outfit who have conceded ten goals this week from a 4-0 loss at Devon rivals, Brixham AFC, and 6-1 set-back at the hands of Winchester City.

There have been a number of new faces arrive at Melksham Town in a bid to pull them out of the bottom four. They go to Exmouth Town, who are looking to keep their play-off ambitions alive, whilst Brixham AFC, who have taken six points this week, take on Larkhall Athletic.

Willand Rovers will be looking to continue their upturn in fortunes as they take on Swindon Supermarine. They find themselves three points and a couple of places behind their opponents, so this is an important one for both clubs. Falmouth Town are only one place out of the bottom four as they go to play-off hopefuls Hartpury FC, whilst Bristol Manor Farm take on mid-table Didcot Town.

Likewise, Marlow will be eager to move closer to MK Irish in the middle of the table when they meet.

Finally, one place and three points separate Welwyn Garden City and Hadley. Both teams were in action on Tuesday with Welwyn Garden City sharing the spoils from a 1-1 home draw with play-off hopefuls, Hertford Town, and Hadley falling at home to in-form Biggleswade Town.
